I felt somewhat depressed, but arose above it finally.

24 Nov. Giordi  
Spoke to Circle of International  
Women of Delirious women.

28 Nov. Lunedì.

29 Nov. Martedì  
This morn at 10 went down

to have Pav. Mangetti go to Bank

"Man" by Leadbeater & Beckett - a  
large book - Told them I was to  
speak at Cultura Hall but they  
had some meeting on. This  
eve at 2 S. Teresa, a small  
hall in Società di Cultura, spoke  
to about 20 - pens, catholic and  
protestant - much interest was  
shown. Sig<sup>ra</sup> Lewis invited the  
people - A Prof. Casselli evinced  
much interest & wants literature.

30 Nov. Mercoledì

Cordelia Verner came and got

1 Dec. Giovedì

"Words of wisdom" - Seven Valleys etc.

He was not in accord with the ideas on education that Jesus had taught otherwise etc. He spoke of different things in the teachings. I got the impression that he feels he knows and an idea contrary to his, he could not, at first; at least accept.

2 Dec. Venedig.  
Raining. Went to call on Sig. Prochet. of the Valdese Church. I told him of the movement, its founders, scope and effect. He was exceedingly interested and deeply felt the spirit of it, I am sure, and agreed to all the fundamental points - even the doing away with the ministers. I felt deeply his sincerity & his great spiritual capacity. We talked for 1½ hours. I left Abdul Baha's address. This afternoon went early to call on Sig. Puccio. She was confined to bed - we had a talk. She gave me some addresses for Genoa & Milan. Went home early.

3 Dec. Laifa.

Got a valiga 104 lire, for carrying stores. Met the Devis and we had tea at Talmuris.

They are both deeply interested and actively so. Will give me addresses for different cities. Conferos. Yes we came to write on the Corona the article for Gnosis. She is original and kind and intelligent - very frank. This eve 4 Dec. Domenica went to Valdese church. Enjoyed sermon by Sig. Prochet on "presence of God". Sig. Orga called. We had long talk. Gave her picture of Abdul Baha. Late went to see Anna Maria. She has invited me to lunch Tuesday.

5 Dec. Lunevi.

Before going out Prof. Berelli called. He is interested. Gave me addresses for sending books to libraries. Offers help. At 3.0. got a telegram from Dr. H. Ley His Reliners Abdul Baha passed to Abha Kingdom. I cannot express my feelings. For the moment all seems gone. My only thought is to go to Laifa!

Saw Rice. Had serious talk.

6 Dec. Marzola

Have decided to return to Milan tomorrow, get my papers ready & leave for Laifa. Cannot work now.

No trains running. Walked across town. Had luncheon with Mrs. Marra. She is more than interested in Bahai teachings. At 3:30 we walked to P.O. to meet Mrs. Orsiaglia, then had tea. Mrs. Marra got cab, insisted on going home to get me a little fountain pen, then took me home. - It is painful to know that the Vassina family are putting on all they can to bill; that so many of my things are missing - that they have over charged for milk.

7 Dec. Mercoledì.

Left Torino at 10:45 arrived at Milano 1:30 - Very cold today. Surprised Family Marri and Uncle's told them my plan.

8 Dec. Gèroldi

went to Credito to engage passage for Egypt. Had Bank telegraph to Naples for \$100 lire. Saw Autonette. Signor Bartogagli came while I was there. And invites me to dinner Sabato - Anna's birthday a fine dinner.

Warmer 9. Dec. Lunedì  
Went to see Alice B. She is in bed with cold. Edo - has been ill also. She did not ask me to write.

10 Dec. Sabato.

Uncle came out with me lovely warm day, went to Av. Rossi to have him advise about a will. At five went to C's. She went up town. Have tea - met returning Av. - Now - Came home early.

11. Domenica  
Washed all soiled clothes - wrote many letters and packed

12. Lunedì.

Got the money from Naples. Went to British Consul for visa - He charged me 10<sup>00</sup> - 230 lire less. Am. Gov. charges British subjects 10<sup>00</sup>. Exorbitant! - Have a reservation on boat "Ursuna" from Trieste - Friday - Dec 16 - to Alexandria.

13. Martedì -  
Wanted a lot of running around with Autonette - met Signor Bartogagli at place for tea. Met Edoardo yesterday asking why this change of cordiality. Today he plumped Autonette to salute

like first (yes, cleaner and better)  
on ocean steamers. A Miss.  
Pigget, english in same  
cabin.

17. Sabato

Arrived at Brindisi sailing  
got off to get some milk for  
nichibes. A fresh maid is now  
another companion in our room.  
We all like fresh air.

18 Dec. Domenica

We are to arrive in Alex  
tomorrow. We were delayed at  
Brindisi 3 hours waiting for the  
train from Rome. Here spoken  
to an Armenian, Mrs. G.  
My physician - at 28 rue  
Nabi Daniel - of the Cause and  
she is reading something in  
French. A Mrs. Lend, Syrian,  
on board, is a cousin of Edna  
Balora. A Mrs. Davidson,  
a missionary near Alexander.

19 Dec. Lunedì.

Locly weather - sea like  
glass. Splendid service and  
good meals II Class. We  
reached Alex. at 6:30 - after  
due inspection, we went  
ashore. Knowing the Windsor  
Hotel I took the man from  
there, and without any diffi-  
culty passed custom. He  
was not backward in his  
price, for he asked me 50 piastres.  
Prices are higher than ever.

20 Dec. Martedì.

Telephoned Mrs. Benachi and  
she asked me to come up.  
Passed the morning remained  
to lunch - then she sent me in  
onto to Hotel. Wrote this morning

to Moh. Said Addeh - He called at 11.15 but I was out, so returned just after 4 - with two others - He told me of the Beloved's quiet passing - He was not confined to bed at all - He talked until 6:30 -

Telegraphed last night to Haifa, asking about going there. Hope to hear soon. -

21 Dec Wednesday -

Went to Saadie for ticket to Haifa - including - Mrs Barakat came with auto and took me - also for a drive Ticket cost £7-13 = 750 piastres including supper - 1-7-8 = It cost to Kantara & "in" to Haifa. This afternoon I went to Shams - one of a believer in Ramleh joined & they - There was Mansur who has married - I met, met an engineer who knew: Telegraph from Haifa - "Heartily welcome arrived this morning - I shall leave tomorrow.

22 Thursday -

Said Affandi, Mansur and his son came to train. Left at 3:10 pm at Bania at 7 where I changed to Gair train. Met a brother in train who won recently the 1st swimming, 2nd finishing of Egypt. On next (Bekhl Bay Rasmin of Dalmatia)

train an Englishman who had the championship of boxing.

Arrived Kantara at 10 - Train out of order so we had to cross Canal in launch with 2 men. As done, as we had fifteen minute walk to train - Train did not arrive until 12 - I had sleep at J. Sime at 12 at 1 P.M.

23 Dec Thursday.

Arrived at 12:30. Rizwani & Hotfallah met me. Found Dr + Mrs Kreg, Mr + Mrs Schaffner from Canada, Mr + Mrs Bosch and Fraulein St. Miss Rosenberg. A great loneliness! At least time went to see the ladies. No longer done here "Marital a" from the Master. Can it be we shall not see him!

24 Dec. Friday.

Walked to tomb this morning. The body of the Beloved is in the center front room, where so often we have heard his voice most still - forever except as it speaks to the heart. Louise + John Bosch & Rizwani - Met Monroe + Rizwani - in carriage so returned with them to Tomb.

25 Dec. Saturday

Sick my brain seems weak,

26 Dec. - Rain

It referred to his leaving his physical body. Many such references were made to his departure, but they did not understand.

26 Dec. Lunedi.

Today as Mr & Mrs Schepkhauser are leaving we said the Baha'i pictures. I also the same in bed while the Beloved descended.

We had tea with the ladies.

Miss Rosenberg brought presents for the children and a tree was dressed up in the Pilgrim house and all decorated. It was a great event for them. It is very cool here! My glove makes the room comfortable. Mr & Mrs S. are leaving filled with the Bahai Spirit.

27. Dec. Martedì.

Nothing of importance. All are awaiting the arrival of Shoghi & Rouhangez with Lady Broomfield. The testament will not be read until they arrive.

28 Dec. Mercoledì.

We heard this morning that Shoghi & others are to be here and today at 5. They arrived. Shoghi - very nervous and

There seems no life - such a void! At 4 P.M. all went to the Tomb. We went to mess meeting in Mosaffar Khaneh, then to Tomb. This is a life now of waiting, waiting for the meeting.

Zorba K. told me that some six months ago the Beloved had a dream: he was in the Morgue standing saying the Azam. the Baha'i to pray - and found many freshie around him, so he continued in the case, then say the prayer - none to be gathered. Finally he left the morgue and when outside came - "I - but he had not finished the prayer, but he didn't know it - I can not return now."

They now tell he referred to the finished work here on the earth.

Again he told the Master about his offering; for him to wait for him would not arrive in time for the funeral.

Another dream - he saw Baha'ullah and he told the Master to "finish the building - not to continue - the ladies, not his son - the room he was working in himself - not they know!"

that I should return to Italy -  
but must await money.

28 June Saturday.

Yesterday Mrs Rousseau & children  
went to Balje, I did not go as  
I was copying the will of the  
Master - for Stoghi Effendi.

29 June Sunday

Stormy day! Did not go to  
Tomb. Yesterday morning at 4 -  
Fräulein Lang left - Negar  
with her + is going to Germany

At the Mrs Nourse, her daughter  
and her boys left for Jerusalem,  
are sailing from Port Said for  
Marseilles on Feb. 7<sup>th</sup>

Today Shoghi Effendi asked  
about Fred Lent, as a business  
man & as a Bahai - He then

Went to Tomb with Lady

6 Feb. Monday  
The Governor of Haifa's wife Mrs. Simms invited Gladys B - Miss Rosenberg & Dr. Ebbes + me to tea. There were present 4 others. I do not remember their names.

Pleasant all, but tiring not to talk of anything but the world and its shadows.

Moreover K. 3 & K - Toba K + Looha K - we all went up to Esmael again's room + sat out in sun -

7. Feb. Tuesday.

Copied on typewriter for Begum Effendi - five and half hours we worked. Will. Each day now Mirza Monir comes to give me a few qt.

Today Moreover K. had another slight stroke after a depressing state of nerves. Now she is to be kept very quiet. Complete rest is needed.

12 Feb. Sunday.

Started to type the "General Letter" about departure of Parker, so that friends may have practicalities. Went up to tomb - walked up alone -

met Rizwanieh + Bahangere.

The work on electric wires continues - last Sunday for first time a few lights were in Tomb. The "redich light" is ready.

14 Feb. Tuesday.

A Bazaar is being held Lady Blomfield, Dr. Ebbes, Mrs. Chamberlain went but I do not feel equal to it - am more tired. Had a lantern last evening.

A number of friends are expected.

15 Feb. Wednesday.

Since Saturday I have been thinking of Aziz - as though he were thinking or writing.

Mr & Mrs Dreyfus arrived today from India - 14 Persian helpers arrived - 3 ladies - Some nice three months coming. Meeting today as usual. This morning spent an hour or more in garden - all the ladies and Khanum were at sitting. Moreover K. is better than yesterday too.

16 Feb. Thursday.

Morning in garden again with ladies,

22 Feb. Wednesday.

From the cable from Mrs Libby  
I know that Mason will arrive  
about March 10 - at Alexandria

He wants me to remain here  
until he arrives. No doubt he  
feels that he cannot alone  
be strong enough.

Today at 12:30 Roy & Mr Mills  
arrived - Mrs Randall came  
in steamer from N.Y. We heard  
she was ill, but she looks quite  
well. However, after the meeting  
in the house, which they attended  
we came out and unfortunately  
she fell on the last step & hurt  
her ankle - it is so noticeable  
that Mr & Mrs D. are very cool - Even

25 Feb. Saturday -

26 Feb. Sunday.

A memorial service was held at Pilgrim House for Mrs. Goodall. Shoghi Effendi asked me to say a few words about Mrs. Goodall - and I gave a little history of her coming into the Cause.

We went on train, the Doctor Ladies - Zia, K - & Rouha K - with Persian women went in carriage early this morning - Móher K - with Rouha & Melvaniye & Sadraye - came with us in train - Lady Blomfield, Miss Rose, Corinne Fine & Kallirayni, Mr Mills & Roy Wilhelm. We visited the Barracks & were

also shown the Arsenal where  
stacks of old cannon balls had  
lain since 1812 - The excavation  
of a cathedral of the time of the  
Crusades, under the Barracks,  
was shown us by the Head man  
of the Police. Arr. home about  
5:30

5 Feb. Friday.

Every one tired - I do not go  
to Tomb. In eve. Rasha K.  
Zooba K. & Rouhangesse came  
to Pilgrim House. Hugli Effendi  
remained after dinner. We had  
singing.

8 Feb. Wed.

At eleven went with Katherine  
True to Tomb. Returned to Garden  
where Holy Ladies were all  
sitting. Monse K. not much

9 Feb. Thursday.

Very lonely - Got up late.  
Cleaned my room for coming  
guests & moved a bed into front  
room for Mason to be with Mr.

cottage, where Mrs Randall was.  
very tired.

10 Feb. Friday.

My voice left me this aft,  
so I was sent to bed. Mason

At noon Herr Conrad Schwartz & wife arrived. Very splendid. Mother K - not better. She may come with me to Italy, & later to Germany.

Hogli Effendi spoke today of my returning to Italy to work - to live there so as to spread the teachings.

16 Thursday -

Went to Tomb with Mason this morning. Poade & wife called.

17 Friday -

Mrs McBain & her son from Chicago, whom Mason met on the boat, arrived today to learn more about the Cause. They came to see - Dryfus had other meetings - people they had met in India. Mrs Mc B. has been a scientist for 20 years.

Letter from Anne Apperson Flint - Letter from Annie Morris that Auntie has boil on breast - am concerned as to nature of this.

18 Saturday -

Mrs Mc B. down to lunch.

At our meeting Zia'ullah arrived. Has been in England, goes back to bad. Tells of new spirit that is penetrating the Cause.

Moreover, decided today to come with me to Italy, later to go to Stuttgart. Robbie Effendi may come also, later. Go to America. We leave the 25<sup>th</sup>.

19 Feb. Sunday.

Not feeling up to going up the mountain. Hogli Effendi sent Mason to Acca with Mr McBain & her son - Visited with the ladies -

20 March Monday.

Today Sophie Effendi went to Acca with Mason, Roy & Mr Mills. Toba Khanum told me the following story apropos of miracles -

The Bab had been sent to Shiraz, as a prisoner, and placed in the house of the Head Police. They hoped to execute him here. Just after he was confined there plague broke out in Shiraz & the son of the Head Police was stricken. This was an only son, & the Head P-

frantically went to the Bab - knowing him as a descendant of Mohammed, - & begged him to save the life of his son.

The Bab was washing his hands at the time, as he told the man to take some of the water & give to the boy to drink. This he did, and after a few hours the boy commenced to recover.

The Head of P. was so thankful, and so touched that he then believed in the Bab. He returned to him & offered him anything he wanted, & said he could go where he chose. He provided the Bab with all that was necessary & the Bab escaped to Lashkhan.

The Head of Police did not conceal that he had done, but told all and said that he felt the plague had visited the City because they had impudched the Bab.

A letter to Mason from Carrie Kinney explains that the last Tablet to America from the Master, a copy was sent to N.Y. by Mrs Ering. Miss Duas asked to send copies to Wash. Chicago & San Francisco.

Khanum was not well today.

A long letter from Anne Apperson Flint. One from Lady

de Lajnel - All is in upset condition.

26 March Sunday.

This morning Shoghi Effendi arranged for carriage to take Mason up the mountain to see about plans for Mashrak-el-Aqmar and other buildings. Miss Rosenberg, Rouhavere Khanum, Lotfallah and I went too. We drove to Monastery on Point, then up past Hotel to grounds where we went for picnic. 8 years ago. Mason treated to coffee at the sun. The morning was very pleasant. Returned at 12:30. In afternoon walked up to Tomb with Mason. Dreyfus & Lady Blomfield left this morning for Damascus going in auto by Beirut. Rouhi Effendi has gone to Cairo to study Arabic until Fall session of school, either in America or England.

Said my farewells. Khanum looks very frail. Had satisfactory talk at dinner with Shoghi Effendi, and short walk. As we went out he gave me a pin with greatest name. Radi wife came to say good-bye.

28 March Tuesday  
27 March Monday

At 4:30 we left the house & at 5:30 train departed. Monroe K had 1<sup>st</sup> class so she could be comfortable. Herr & Frau Szwartz also in First. Ahmed Effendi & I in Second. Arr. at Kantara at 6. Left at 7. arr. at Bania Lla - 10 P.M. We had a little lunch in station, then descended. Train arrives at 1 A.M. Monroe K. with Ivars (15) went into compartment alone. With Ahmed Eff. in second & a fellowman arrived at Alex. 5 A.M. came to Grand Hotel. Milk stove kept very well.

After noon we shopped. Morassa came in eve with husband. Mrs. Ifaydi insisted on M. Khanum going to his home. I made objections as I felt she would see too many people.

28 March Wed.

Wrote to Monroe Khanum about our trip. Tais Ullam & Joref Ef came to hotel & accompanied us to steamer. We found Consul & Mrs. Szwartz on board & alang & today Mrs S. in our room - also an Italian Signora. The Signora objected so was changed, then Mrs S. asked to be with husband & went, so Monroe K & I remained alone. She went to

table & even now looks better.

30 March Thurs.

Sea quite good. Very tired.  
Got a chair on deck for Monseñor K  
and he rested there most of  
the day. A goodly number of  
people - not very interesting.  
A couple at our table professed  
they, the wife, American &  
husband English. Mr. & Mrs.  
Beaver. Found she knew &  
met too close with Bessie  
Hopper. & heard mentioned in  
mysterious way the Bahai  
Cause. She later came to Palestine  
with Red Cross - to some missionary  
took her to Balye where she  
went to Moh. Ali's house. I  
tried to straighten her, but found  
she had little interest - maiden

to Cornell with Miss Hopper.

31 March - Fri.

Last night Monseñor K & I both

We arrived at 7 A.M. Parkes  
man took us flying thru the

June 5. Monday.

June 6. Tuesday.

This noon about 11 - they  
came to see M. K. ~~Wald~~

For ever they sent for us to go to  
Kurhaus, where they had friends.  
We remained until 10:30. Coming  
home we heard the nightingales  
for first time.

June 7. Wednesday.

Sent a box specially to Mrs.  
S. Went down town with Aunt  
this eve Mrs. Mrs. S. came then  
asked us to go to Kurhaus as  
the blind doctor was alone.

I had talk with him. He  
said he would care me - for  
me to drink coffee after  
dinner & he tried to tell me  
with part - but did not see  
clearly - He says he will  
teach English in a few  
weeks so as to speak to me when  
next I see him.

I am not sure of his powers  
we shall see. Cousin B. and  
Schwartz are much taken.

June 9. Friday  
Very hot - Went to bed at  
noon, too tired to eat.

June 10. Sat.

Franklin H. came in eve.

June 11 - Sun  
Wrote letters afternoon. Until  
1 - this morn there was a  
supper on balcony below and  
I could not sleep. As the Doctor  
& wife of manager were present  
we could say nothing - Very

cold so we remained in bed.  
Knitted.

June 12. Sun

Not much happened. Usual  
daily lessons - A letter from  
K. Redford suggesting her coming  
to Rome this winter & having  
an apartment, I to be with  
her. It would be well for the  
Cause - a good service. It  
will solve some of my problems

Sat. 17 -

Yesterday we went down town

with Faulein to do some shopping - Bo's a coffee pot to make express - etc. Counsel & wife are here. He arrived last night, she at 1 P.M. today. Returning from town Auntie and I sat down in Park - C. S. came along, and soon his wife. They did not call on M. K. Lennorme is important day here.

Today it rained hard, but let up so that the Operetta was given in the Park. We did not go out. Mrs. S. came, also Dr. to talk about our going to Black Forest. We hope to decide tomorrow. More to K. Ledgard & said I would like the plan she suggested, Auntie feeling better.

19 June - Monday.

Went to Bank with Auntie - and exchange - 6 1/2 lire for 100 marks Sterling here @ 1400 - I lost. Took last German lesson today. Faulein leaves this evening. Went down with her after her lesson with Moreverk - and did some errands. At nine we went to station to say goodbye to her. She is a very kind person. Frau Schwanz left

today and did not see her again.

20 June - Tuesday - yesterday this I had lost my diamond necklace - could not find it in room - In afternoon I went to Porter, and he said a guest had picked it up in the Hall. I could not get it in the Office then, so went in the evening - Here the Porter said that the man wanted a Reward -- to be given to the help in Kurskau. I asked the Porter to ask him what he wanted. When he found it was an American he said 5% of value, & that it was worth 150,000 Marks. Imagine! I could not see him, but today the Porter suggested that Counsel Schwanz attend to it - It seems he saw him in eve, and told him a few things. He came to see M. Klamann, and when they came up from the Dr's room he spoke to me - very jolly - Auntie had come in worried too. Her landlord had said she must go - C. Schwanz said he would have someone phone to him. They have now left the Reward to me. I would prefer giving it to the help in Kurskau.

21 June Wednesday  
Much warmer. It seems Counsel

Schwarz invited Monseur K. to dinner today. She went to dentist & returned too tired. I was not asked. Queer politeness here!

Kern & Frau Lerrigal came on Monday to call, and yesterday also. They are very sincere and kindly - are here as guests of the Schwarz. We cannot get settled on where we are to go in Black Forest. All hunting fire now closed for another place C. S. has planned it was to.

22 June Thursday.  
Aussue fr. Hundseck in Bl. Forest and we are to go there. Pen. in Hotel Plattlik 240 to 280 francs given 2450 to 49 persons employed in Holzschule - extra.

Cous. Schwarz invited M. Khan to the Concert last night. When he came he found me at table and most adroitly asked if the ladies were ready. I did not answer but when he was ready to go he turned to me - and I said - O, no. I am not dressed for the Concert. etc - did not get an invitation. He felt very much confused.. Such carelessness must be noticed. He is most generous, but I feel there is a little undercurrent - w. I cannot quite

understand - also the doctor of late. They did not want us to come to Stuttgart, and to make the long trip fr. 4 A.M. to 6 P.M. Fr. Walter asserted my opinion, and that did not please the doctor. I shall be glad to become indep. Don't mind it is to receive obligations. We leave tomorrow for Stuttgart at 6.45.

23 J. - Fri.

Arr. at 1 P.M. late. Walked fr. Station to Continental Hotel - very tired. Had lunch then slept. Went out at five and shopped with Auntie. Mrs. Frau Hauff. Nagel & Johanna are at seaside.

Locly trip from Mergentheim - beautifully cultivated - all green - a great scarcity of horses is most noticeable everywhere. So few here in Stuttgart - even few autos in streets. All seems so serious.

24 June. Sat.

Fran Hauff called at 9:30 - very kindly. Insisted on going with me to a shop. Took us to place where I got a fine traveling and rain coat for 3500 M. & to 224 lire. Found a nice Quircheday blue dress for 3950 - what I will need this winter. It is difficult

shopping with a number. Things  
are not so cheap here as when Mason  
came a year ago - tramped all over.

Find a strong spirit of prejudice  
for foreigners. Today the Minister  
of Foreign Affairs was shot in  
Berlin by two masked men.  
Great trouble. Silesia has separated  
herself from Germany. Each fresh  
trouble makes them sicker.  
What is coming? The Poste in  
Hotel tonight said that the moment  
France is alone = (if she breaks with  
Germany) the Germans will finish  
her. It is dreadful to think of  
the hatred existing... People are  
so curious about us - seeing  
Dr. Khanum.

25 June - Tues.

This morning went to  
Wildschloss - a small  
villa all in Moorish archi-  
tecture and finishing - quite old.  
Gardens are wonderful. Reisenstein  
Palace was not open - we landed  
in a garden with special attention  
to a large omelette - one bread - rice  
lettuce salad and cup of coffee -  
I paid 40. m.m. or equivalent  
about 15 cents. Mrs Hauff came to see  
us. She is very plain and kindly -  
We expect to go to Hotel Blattig in

Freudenstock \_\_\_\_\_ Stuttgart.  
Baden. They planes 240 to 280 M.  
but have written 300 to 340 M.

26 June Mond.

Met Frau Schwarz to shop with M.K.  
We were to leave at 1:05. I went to see  
the blind Dealer with Frau L. He told  
me I should be more alone, eat slowly,  
take coffee after dinner; have help in  
Italy with the work, and above all should  
not go to bed with M.K. - where she  
might get pneumonia; also we  
should not remain in G. long as there  
are to be gr. disturbances. Saturday, the  
Minister of Foreign Affairs was killed  
and revolution is feared - How can I  
to change affairs when it was 11 A.M.

Returned after talking to Frau L. and  
thinking M.K. must see a nerve specialist  
so that she would be more certain & he  
will advise her. She determined  
to do this, and so we changed. We  
did not know where we would go, but  
Frau Hauff knew of a Pension in  
Freudenstock - We telephoned, got  
rooms there for three and will go  
tomorrow at 3:30. My bag was checked  
tickets bought etc - all changed. Showed  
all day. Neger & Johanna Hauff are  
at the sea in north Germany. They  
went by auto with friends. We say this  
will be a cool summer.

27 June Tuesday  
Showers. Left Stuttgart at 3:35.  
From station - much "baggage".  
Changed train at Oettingen - waited 1/2  
hour & arrived at 6:05. On the  
train was a young German who  
had been in Ann. ten years.

The Hotel Continental in Stuttgart  
treated us every way - the Head  
waiter and the Porter - Janus  
twisted. I bought a rain and  
burning coal for 3 and  
a good blue dress for 3200.  
Not cheap but reasonable. - We  
could not find a man from  
Fraulein Meyers, so managed  
to get a man with a one horse  
chaise. Behind this he trailed  
a station wagonette with our  
baggage, - and so we arrived  
at Haus Schaeffer. Pleasant  
people. Auntie and I in a double  
room tonight - M.K. a single  
room at rear - much fun.

(v) 28 June Wednesday  
Grace is said. A bell rings  
to call attention. Not much  
friendliness. Fraulein P  
is very pleasant. - Did not  
walk - wrote some letters -  
Letter from Georgia forwarded

from Plattig saying she  
would not come etc -

29 June Thursday.  
Wrote 8 letters today. Did  
not go out. Meals very good  
here. Yesterday moved into  
next house until there will  
be a vacant room. Pleasant  
train here. Telephoned to  
Mergenthaler - Porter astonished  
me were here.

30 June Friday.  
Wrote 8 more letters. Went  
to Oberamt and had to pay 300  
M. Had tea in a nice little Café.  
Tomorrow postage goes to  
6 M. ausland - 3 Deutschland.  
3.50 p.c "

1 July Saturday.  
Wrote and sent my 2  
Ex. to Fraulein Holloman.  
At 4 P.M. we all three took  
a walk in the woods. It is  
lovely! The trees are dense pine  
& firs - air splendid.

2 July Sunday.  
Studied trees today. M.K.  
& I walked up the hill in  
the woods. - lovely. But  
brought memories of past tramps  
- flooding my mind with  
reminiscences.

3 July - Monday.  
Sewed, studied some. Queen custom at table. Fräulein Mayers rings the bell - all are still - and she says a Grace - always the same. Rained hard tonight

4 July - Tuesday.  
Letter from Fräulein Hollmann with advanced lessons; also a small German Dictionary.

Went to Bank with M.K - Pound Sterling 1900<sup>00</sup> - Dollar 415. I got only 1285. We went shopping, found some nice stockings - for 680 m. woolen. One for me, also one for Boba K.

In afternoon we went again

5 July - Wed.  
Auntie not well today and yesterday I think - Knitted, sewed & studied. Took a long walk alone - It is beautiful here. Would like to take an auto trip thru Schwazgau.

9 July - Sun.

No news all the week. It has rained, thundered and between times the sun has shone. Have studied, knitted, written letters. M.K. seems brighter the past few days. Have

just returned from a 1/2 walk alone. To get warm. The people in the Pension seem to soften up a bit. Finished rereading "The Potato Pass" in the night - who recalled Mrs. - who was a student in Melana and returned on same ship to Am in 1897. He said I reminded him of Bernadine - I cannot now see how.

10 July Thurs.

Sun came out, M.K. is resting for a few days so Auntie and I were going down town. As she came out she got a letter telling of the death of Adelaide Wright, Uncle's niece; so we walked into the woods, then up to Frederick's hole and had a good cup of tea. Coming back the path that b'rt us back from lodgings. Having queer dreams - trying to get away & get Ella ready.

11 July Tuesday

Cloudy, cool. Studied - took a less on yesterday from Fräulein Fritz - who has just arrived from Frankfurt. Too poor - has a aunt. At 4 - M.K., Auntie & I walked up to have tea again - Evening we had games after dinner. Rained very hard - Heavy spirits these days -

16 July Sunday.

Raining - cold. Wednesday with Frulein Fritz we went to Hotel Stockinger for tea.

Thursday a letter came from Ahmed Yagdi Effendi Jr. Genoa where he had just arrived. Expected to come on immediately after a day in Milan. - No news since. M.K. is much upset - works badly. Has telegraphed to Genoa, now we have written to Cooks Milano. It is strange why he has not sent word. Have been feeling down. Friday we walked down on the Promenade - very pretty - in front of Hotel Ruppert & Waldbeck Pres. This is housed at Waldbeck. Saturday had coffee at Diele. Too crowded. Sir. July - enjoys life. Today cold. This aft a telephone from Ahmed Effendi from Stuttgart where he arr. today. M.K. much relieved.

17 July Monday.

Windy & rainy. Went to station to meet A.Y. - He looks very well.

18 July Tues.

Cloudy. We went to Stockinger for tea.

19. Wed.

Slomry. Asked Frulein to Diele to tea. Auntie came - a short walk after.

20 Thursday

We all went to Baden Baden on the "Rubber Neck." A wonderful drive between the forest and hills - thru interesting valleys and old quaint towns. At B.B. we took a carriage & drove for an hour. Lively residence - a continuous garden. Sun came out briefly - warm - first pleasant day. Could not but think of Amy & Harry who used to come to B.B. Wonder where she is? Took us from 9. a.m. to 11:45 to go - with 15 min stops at an inn. Came back by Deibors Eisenstein - left at 4:25 arr. here 7:25 = 22 in auto. It cost, the trip 395 Marks. At present exchange not a dollar. But I got only 250, so it cost me over a dollar. Luncheon 85M. + the drive 95 a piece - less than a tram ride that length.

21 July Friday

Pleasant. A letter from K. Ledyard. saying she wants to come to Rome in Nov. rather Europe. Wants me to go to Haifa with her

but Dr. K. advises going  
in Spring. Wants me to go with  
her, keep her as a friend  
companion. She pay all living  
& travelling expenses - Have a place  
for people to come for the teachings.  
I answered I would do this.

Wonder what Auntie will  
think! I can keep her more.

22 July Saturday

We had tea at Friederichs  
turne yesterday - Auntie not  
feeling well - think we need more  
nourishment. Flowers today all too

No news all week. weather

Today a picnic was planned -

Letter yesterday from Lizzie. Parish after so many years of silence. She expects to come to Europe and wants some addresses. Spoke of Mattie & Nellie's death - Auntie had decided to go to Frankfurt on Wednesday. Had such a sleeping & dream last night.

Dream.

This I was with Dick & Mosher just outside father was supposed to be in a vault. Dick opened this, and I plainly saw Father waiting sitting in the coffin - he was brought into the house - taken out of the coffin - he opened his eyes, and looked at me - His eyes were very blue.

For Dick asked him what his condition was, - being dead and yet alive - he answered that we could not understand if he should tell us. I remember he said something unkind to me, but what it was I do not recall - I awoke.

14 Aug. Mon.

Showers, but managed to lie in sun on sofa - Some better. Stotters gone to Baden-Baden. and stayed most of day.

15 Aug. Tues.

Very bad thunderstorms in sight. Rained all day.. Letter from Ahmad Yuzdi Effendi - could not find Shoghi Effendi at Dule-laken - At Isenheim - Dreijfus refused by telegraph to give the address - What a nerve! Mr. Khanum telegr. to return to Stuttgart.

16 Aug. Wed.  
At 10:30 Auntie left with  
Fritzi's sister for Frankfort.  
Hope she is happy there.  
First day out - for nine days.  
Went with M. K. to have some  
chocolate - Tonight have lame  
left side - Very quiet it seems.

17. Aug. Thursday  
Thirty years today since J.K.  
and I were married in Auntie's  
front room on Geary St. San  
Francisco. - What changes have  
come! J.K. gone! Uncle gone!  
Grandma & grandpa both gone -  
even the house gone, destroyed  
by the Big Fire of '06! Auntie;  
and I in Germany!! The old  
outlook upon life changed,  
hardly a vestige of resemblance  
to past days remained! And  
in the years to come - - more  
changes! Thirty years ago today

The Duomo has paintings of Melchizedek & statues. The nun, with face covered by black veil, shows St. Chiara's body, also covers her. We drove to St. Maria degli Angeli - where St. Francis lived. The small hut, and also church that was near, built of stone, renewed by St. Francis are built over in the present Cathedral. The via Vescovio and old gate are relics of the gilded past.

Raining. Visited the Museum at Duomo. very interesting. This Duomo was to be much larger but the plague broke out and it was never completed. It is perhaps the most richly decorated Façade church. In the Library are splendid things of Pompeii.

Had luncheon with Mr & Mrs Collins, then they left at 2 P.M. with Rangi in auto, for Naples - to leave Wednesday on Dante Alighieri. After I left them I went to call on Miss Hedge. It came about so that I asked her what had happened between her and Mrs Le May. She then told me how Catherine had been to see her and demanded an invitation to a ball given by Mrs Le May. That she had not acted like a "lady" - and spoke of various things she had noticed. Cath. told me she had asked for the invitations to the tea that we got. Miss H. said she did not - She asked for the ball. Poor Catherine! A letter from her - his - telling me she was going to Picchia and then to Florence - this I would know when I arrived in Rome.

24 April Tuesday

At books found cable

27 Apr. Friday

At Books this morn found letter fr. Poldi, with 75<sup>c</sup> + from Humboldt 30<sup>c</sup> letters from Mrs Collins. French - Ella. Sig<sup>r</sup>. Vardi came to station. We left bags in car for a moment, returned to find my black hand bag

London, last Wednesday, with  
Rulin who joins him in  
Paris. I trust this move will  
prove a right one. I hope  
funds will be realized to  
keep him there. Strange how  
some deep unseen tie holds me  
in my duty towards him, while  
only tears are my reward. Some
