21. Nov. Lunedì.

Having finished the book on "Holy Sacrament" by Leadbeater I took it to Sign<sup>re</sup> Bulone at 4:30 today. She was alone so we had a good talk. She gave me much light on Theosophy and loaned me "Man" by Lead + Percant. I have not yet felt prompted to speak to her about the Cause. She is very earnest & sincere.

22. Nov. Martedì.

Read "Man" - it offers much food for thought and opens up vistas that are given by Baha'is. Mrs Morra called for me at 4:30 & took me to tea at "Milan Rest". She says she agrees with all the teachings but cannot quite yet accept the Manifestation - except as great men. Both she and

her husband are thus far. She brot me home in cab. A note was here from a "Talmone" mis called and would be at Hospital near until 9. Mrs M. took me there. We thot it best & it proved so. This Sig wants me to call tomorrow at 3 pm. then in the ev. meet with a Circle - attached I believe to "Far of East". We felt happy at the result. As I was going to a meeting in Hall of Commerce, Mrs M. invited me to dine & go from there.

24 Nov. Giordani

Spoke to Circle of "International"

29 Nov. Martedi

This morn at 10 went down

to have Cav. Manzetti go to Bank  
with me & cash a check. at  
Agricola Bank - About 4. I called  
at Sig. Balais to take back  
"Man" by Leadbeater & Pascoe - a  
large book - Told them I was to  
speak at Cultura Hall but they  
had some meeting on. This  
ev. at 2 S. Teresa, a small  
hall in Societa di Cultura, spoke  
to about 20. - Jews, Catholic and  
protestant - much interest - was  
shown. Sig. Levi invited the  
people - A Prof. Caselli evinced  
much interest & wants literature

30 Nov. Mercoledì

Did not go out, but wrote

1 Dec. Giovedì

A little snow. Met Sig. Oneglia  
at her school. We went to Seluone  
for tea & talked until 6. I feel she  
will be a Bahai after a time.

Sig. Manzetti came this ev.

"Words of Wisdom" - Seven Valleys etc.  
His one eminent was, that

he was not in accord with the ideas on education; that Jesus had taught otherwise etc. We spoke of different things in the teachings - I got the impression that he felt he knew and an idea contrary to his, he could not, at first, at least accept.

2 Dec. Venerdì.

Raining. Went to call on Sig Prochet of the Valdese Church. I told him of the movement, its founders, scope and effect. He was exceedingly interested and deeply felt the spirit of it, I am sure, and agreed to all the fundamental points - even the doing away with the ministers. I felt deeply his sincerity & his great spiritual capacity. We talked for 1 1/2 hours. I left Abdul Bahia's address. This afternoon went early to call on Sy<sup>na</sup> Penco. She was confined to bed - we had a talk. She gave me some addresses for Genova & Milano. Went home early.

3 Dec. Sabato.

Got a ranga 124 lire, for carrying Stora's. Met the Levi's and we had tea at Talmon's.

Conterosa Vesma came to write on the Corona the article for Innois. She is original, but kind and intelligent - very frank. This eve 4 Dec. Domenica went to Valdese Church.

Enjoyed sermon by Sig. Paschet on "presence of God". Sig. Regia came - we had long talk. Gave her picture of Abdul Bahia. Lati went to see P. M. Morra. She has invited me to lunch Tuesday.

5 Dec. Lunedi.

Before going out Prof. Bartelli called. He is interested. Gave me addresses for sending books to Libraries. Offers help. At P.O. got a telegram from Dr. L. Seef. His holiness Abdul Bahia passed to Abha Kingdom. I cannot express my feelings. For the moment all seems gone - My only that is to go to Laifa.

Saw P. Ricci & had serious talk.

6 Dec. Martedi

Have decided to return to Milano tomorrow, get my papers ready & leave for Laifa. Cannot work now.

Milano

No trams running. Walked down town. Had luncheon with Mrs. Morra. She is more than interested in Bahai teachings.

At 3:30 we walked to P.O. to meet Mrs. Oraglia, then had tea. Mrs. Marra got cab, insisted on going home to get me a little fountain pen, then took me home. - It is painful to find that the Vagina family are putting on all they can to bill; that so many of my things are missing - that they have over charged for milk.

7 Dec. Mercoledì.

Left Torino at 10:45 arrived at Milano 1:30 - Very cold today. Surprised Family Marri and Auntie. Told them my plans.

8 Dec. Giovedì

went to book to engage passage for Egypt. Had Bank telegraph to Naples for 2000 lire. Saw Antonette. Signor Portogallo came while I was there. Out - Auntie me to dinner Sabato - Auntie birthday a fine dinner.

Mercoledì

9 Dec. Venerdì

Went to see Alice B. She is in bed with cold. Eds. has been ill also. She did not ask me to write.

10 Dec. Sabato.

Auntie came out with me lovely warm day. Went to Av. Bossi to have her advice about a will. At five went to G's. She & I went up town to have tea - met returning Av. - 3/11. Came home early.

11. Domenica

Washed all soiled clothes - wrote many letters and packed

12. Lunedì

Got the money from Naples. Went to British Consul for visa - He charged me £10. - 230 lire - Dec. Am. Gov. charges British subjects 10. Exorbitant! - Have a reservation on boat "Veuve" from Trieste - Friday - Dec 16 - to Alexandria.

13. Martedì

Warm. Did a lot of running around with Antonette. met Signor Portogallo at place for tea. Note Edouardo yesterday asking why this change of cordiality. Today he phoned Antonette to salute

Milano - Trieste.

mae tante, that he had my address  
alho I put it on the note - also for  
me to send my address from Paifa -  
From Vanzini, the optician - I  
got a pair of glasses free - weather  
turned cold.

⑧ 14 Dec. Giovedì

Took the train at 9:50 for  
Trieste - arr. 8 P.M. went to  
La Ville Hotel - Room & heat 20.50  
entire bill 36.50 - Wrote a note  
to Sig. Bazzanovich -

⑨ 15 Dec. Venerdì

Finished packing tried to write  
will, but did not finish - went to  
Cook's, also did some shopping.

16 - Venerdì -

Got up at 8 - wrote postals  
to Auntie, Annie & Antoinette.  
Came to steamer Vienna at  
11:30 - Second class is very good -  
like first - (yes, cleaner and better)  
on ocean steamers - A Miss  
Piquet, English in same  
cabin.

17. Sabato

Arrived at Brindisi - raining  
got off to get some milk for  
michies - A french maid is now  
another companion in our room.  
We are like fresh air.

18 Dec. Domenica

We are to arrive in Alex  
tomorrow. We were delayed at  
Brindisi 3 hours waiting for the  
train from Rome - There spoken  
to an Armenian, Mrs G.  
Miyhisdician - at 28 rue  
Nebi Daniel - of the Cause and  
she is reading some things in  
French. A Mrs Lind, Syrian,  
on board, is a cousin of Edna  
Balora - A Mrs Davidson,  
a missionary near Alexander.

19 Dec. Lunedì

Lovely weather - sea like  
glass. Splendid service and  
good meals II Class. We  
reached Alex. at 6:30 - after  
due inspection, we went  
ashore. Knowing the Windsor  
Hotel I took the man from  
there, and without any diffi-  
culty passed custom. He  
was not backward in his  
price, for he asked me 50 piastres.  
Prices are higher than ever.

20 Dec. Martedì

Telephoned Mrs Penschi and  
she asked me to come up.  
Passed the morning, remained  
to lunch - then she bro't me in  
auto to Hotel - wrote this morning

to Moh. Said Adieu - He called at 11.15 but I was out, so returned just after 4 - with two others - He told me of the Beloved's quiet passing - He was not confined to bed at all - We talked until 6:30 -

Telegraphed last night to Haifa, asking about going there. Hope to hear soon. -

21 + 22 Wednesday + Thursday

Went to Cassi's for ticket to Haifa - including - Mrs Barachi came with auto and took me - also for a driver Ticket cost £7-13 = 750 piastres including supper - 1-7-8 = 11<sup>00</sup> to Kaulara + bus to Haifa. It is a distance I want to (Rams) - one of it believe in Kaulara Joseph & Olga - There was Manassa who has married - A new engineer was hired. Telegram from Haifa - "Heartily welcome" arrived this morning - I shall leave tomorrow.

22 Thursday -

Said Affendi, Mamma and Lucia came to train. Left at 3:30. Arrived at Haifa at 7 - where I changed to Cairo train. Met above on train who was recently the last swimmer, a friendship of long standing. On next (Bakul Bey Rasmin - of Palmietie)

From an engineer man who had his championship of boxing. Arrived at Kaulara at 10. Bridge out of order so we had to cross channel in launch with. As we went down, as we had fifteen minute walk to train - Baggage did not arrive until 12 - Had sleep. Train at 10 at 10 A.M.

23 Dec. Sunday.

Arrived at 12:30. Rouhi & Lotfollah met me. Found Dr + Mrs Kueg, Mr + Mrs Schloffer from Canada, Mr + Mrs Bosch and Fraulein Dr Miss Rosenberg. A great loneliness! At last time went to see the ladies - No longer do we hear "Marhaba" from the Master. Can it be we shall not see him!

24 Dec. Sunday

Walked to tomb this morning. The body of the Beloved is in the center front room, where so often we have heard his voice most still - faint except as it speaks to the hearts. Louise + John Bosch & Rizwanieh - met Monege + Brakli - in carriage so returned with them to Tomb.

25 Dec. Domenica

Still my brain seems numb.



There seems no life - such  
a void! At 4 P.M. all went to  
the Tomb. We went to men's meeting  
in Mosafar Khaneh, then to Tomb.

This is a life now of waiting,  
waiting for the meeting.

Tooba K. told me that some  
six months ago the Beloved had  
a dream: He was in the Mosque  
standing saying the Azan. The  
call to prayer - and found many  
people around him, so he continued  
with the call, they say the prayer - not  
to be followed. Finally he left the  
mosque and when outside remem-  
bered that he had not finished

the prayer, but he thought "never mind"  
I did not return word.

They now feel he referred to the  
finished work. "Here on the  
earth."

Another dream - he told the Master  
of the "li" of the "li"; for him to  
return, for he would not arrive  
in time for the funeral.

Another dream - He saw Baha  
"Bah" and he told the Master to  
"destroy the building - not to  
destroy - the leaders. But his  
heart the room he was working  
on himself - not they know!

Cool - rain

it referred to his leaving his  
physical body. Many such  
references he made to his  
departure, but they did not  
understand.

26 Dec. Lunedi.

Today as Mr & Mrs Schepshkeby  
are leaving we saw the Holy  
pictures & also the room in

Rain 27. Dec. Martedi.

Nothing of importance. All  
are awaiting the arrival of  
Shoghi & Rouhangez with Lady  
Bloomfield, the testament will  
not be read until they arrive.

28 Dec. Mercredi.

We heard this morning that  
Shoghi & others are to be here  
and today at 5. They arrived.  
Shoghi is very nervous and

worn out - Lady Blomfield  
with them is now in Pelgrim  
House with us. This morning  
I had a nice visit with family  
in what was the room of the  
Beloved - Ahmad Yuzdi, <sup>off.</sup>  
came from Port Said with the  
party.

29 Dec. Givendi  
Sun shining. Today I heard  
that some days before the  
Beloveds ascended, he called  
the Gardener Esmed, ya and  
asked if he wanted anything  
for the garden. The gardener  
said "no", and then the  
Master said "It is finished,  
it is finished!" - he never  
went into garden again.

In the tea-room all were  
assembled this morning.  
Zia K - was chanting Tablets.

31, Dec. Tabalo  
Clear but cloudy. At tea  
today Toobak + Zia K. were  
telling me some of history of  
Cause. They said that in  
1850 - the Bab was martyred -

7 Jan 1922.

This morning, rather unex-  
pectedly we were called to  
hear the resignation of  
the Master read. It took his  
own, with an extra table  
included. Much talking &  
weeping when he referred  
to the hardships endured  
from the Nakazy. Much  
talking when he mentioned  
that Saqqi Effendi would  
be the head of the Cause.  
Many expressions of loyalty

and believe great comfort  
is felt that the Beloved has  
left for us a head and  
thereby strengthened the  
solidity of the Cause.

8 - Sunday Jan.

The Beloved has said in  
His will that those who turn  
to Saqqi Effendi turn to God,  
& those who turn away from him  
have turned away from God.  
He is left the Guardian of the  
Cause & head of the H. of Justice.  
He is to choose for among the  
"Hands of God" - some who are  
to select 9 who will form  
a Council to aid him at  
all times.

It is cold and I did not go  
to Tomb. The ladies did not go  
up.

15 Jan. Sunday.

All week have had little  
to write. Friday we were  
surprised by arrival of Mrs  
Nourse, her daughter and two  
sons. They are placed in  
house where the Master stayed  
- near Enay at Ullah's.

Mrs Gray has decided to go  
to America - D. K. goes to Germany

The Bosch's leave on Tuesday.  
Am helping Roubi to translate part of the will of the Master. It is so strong concerning the Nakagant.  
No letters - I wonder why.

16 Jan Monday

With Roubi Ef. + M. Lili Mohammed Khan I have been translating into English, a part of the blessed will of the Master. It is very difficult.

Mrs + Mrs Bosch are leaving tomorrow - Sunday, yesterday visited to Tomb of Bab with Tawba Khanum. She spoke of violations in America. All are much concerned. Letter from Roy saying that "Zia + Mason" are the "police" of the Cause.

17 Jan - Tuesday.

At 10 - The Bosch's left for Jerusalem - Franklin Rauf went with them, but will return. She also leaves soon with Negar also to spend six months in Germany as her guest.

22 Jan Sunday

Rained yesterday, but today it is clear. Franklin returned today from Jerusalem. Finished translating part of will on Friday.

1922

Letters came on Friday delayed. Letter from Mrs French yesterday with James remembrance of \$20.00. Am writing today. Khanum says she sleeps well now - since I put her sock at night.

24 Jan - ~~at~~ Tuesday

Days pass so rapidly one cannot count them. Shopia Effendi went to Tomb on Sunday - met with friends. Thunderstorm last night. Letter fr. Co K says package lost so long has been found - containing sugar, tea + coffee, also picture of Master. Had to send 150 lire for expenses.

25 June Wednesday

Rainy - damp. Had a hamaah yesterday. Wrote letters this morning. Have a strong feeling that I should return to Italy - but must await money.

28 June Saturday

Yesterday Mrs Mousseo children went to Balize, I did not go as I was copying the will of the Master - for Shopia Effendi.

29 June - Sunday

Stormy day! Did not go to Tomb. Yesterday morning at 4 - Franklin Rauf left - Negar with her + is going to Germany.

- At ten Mrs Nourse, her daughter  
and two boys left for Jerusalem,  
are sailing from Port Said for  
Marseilles on Feb. 7<sup>th</sup>

Today Shoghi Effendi asked  
about Fred Lunt, as a business  
man & as a Bahai. He then  
asked about Mr Mills. He  
wants two Americans to come  
and consult. I am disheartened  
and trust that the Beloved  
will protect and guide the  
choice.

30 Jan. Monday  
Hear that telegrams have  
been sent to Roy Mitchell &  
Mr Mills, to come.

31 Jan Tuesday  
Tonight a boy came from  
Bahiji saying that the  
Nabazene had gone to  
Bahiji and taken  
the keys of Tomb from  
the keeper. Some believe  
went over to the Government  
and it was adjusted.

4 Feb. Sat.  
Stormy. - Monover K. - had  
a slight stroke yesterday. Dr  
thinks it is nerves. Mrs  
Fraser-Chamberlain, Dr Bertia,  
Ebbes, Dr Cummins, arrived  
at 5:30. Khanum not so  
well.

5 Feb. Sunday  
Went to Tomb with Lady  
Polomfield & came down with  
her. Sleep little as am in room  
with Dr Ebbes & Mrs C. & they  
retire late.

6 Feb. Monday

The Governor of Haifa's wife Mrs James, visited Maddy B - Miss Rosenberg Dr Ebbs + me to tea. There were present 4 others. Do not remember their names.

Pleasant all, but trying not to talk of anything but the world and its shadows.

Monever K. - Zia K. - Tooba K. - + Looha K. - we all went up to Camalaga's room + sat out in sun -

7. Feb. Tuesday.

Copied on typewriter for Soghri Effendi - five and half hours we worked. Will

Each day now Mirza Monev comes to give me a lesson.

Today Monever K. - had another slight stroke after a depressing state of nerves. Now she is to be kept very quiet. Complete rest is needed.

12 Feb. Sunday.

Started to type the "General Letter" about departure of Our hero, so that friends may have particulars. Went up to Tomb - walked up alone -

met Riguianich + Kulkangess.  
The work on electric wires continues - Last Sunday for first time a few lights were in Tomb. The "redich light" is ready.

14 Feb. Tuesday.

A Bazaar is being held Lady Blomfield, Dr Ebbs, Mrs Chamberlain went, but I do not feel equal to it - am nerve tired. Had a hamam last evening.

A number of friends I am expected.

15 Feb. Wednesday.

Since Saturday I have been thinking of Aziz - as though he were thinking or writing.

Mr + Mrs Dreyfus arrived today from India - 14 Persian pilgrims arrived - 3 ladies - Some were three months coming. Meeting today as usual. This morning spent an hour or more in garden - all the ladies and Khannums were out sitting.

Monever K. is better + was out yesterday too.

16 Feb. Thursday.

Morning in garden again with ladies.

until Mason arrives 17 Feb. Friday.

Mrs Fraser - Chamberlain, Dr  
Ebbes & Dr Cummins - left

March 19 - Sunday.

Not feeling up to going up the mountain. Shoghi Effendi sent Mason to Acca with Mrs McBain & her son. I visited with the ladies.

20 March Monday.

Today Shoghi Effendi went to Acca with Mason, Roy & Mr Mills. Toba Khanum told me the following story apropos of miracles -

The Bab had been sent to Shiraz, as a prisoner, and placed in the house of the Head Police. They hoped to execute him there. Just after he was confined there plague broke out in Shiraz & the son of the Head Police was stricken. This was an only son, & the Head P.

Story

frankly went to the Bab - knowing him as a descendant of Mohammed, - & begged him to save the life of his son.

The Bab was washing his hands at the time, so he told the man to take some of the water & give to the boy to drink.

This he did, and after a few hours the boy commenced to recover -

The Head of P. was so thankful, and so touched that he then believed in the Bab. He returned to him - offered him anything he wished, & said he could go where he chose - He provided the Bab with all that was necessary & the Bab escaped to Isphahan -

The Head of Police did not conceal that he had done, but told all and said that he felt the plague had visited the City because they had imprisoned the Bab.

Mason leaves soon. Miss Watson & Miss Rosenberg will remain.

Telegram came to Shoghi Eff. saying that "Mrs Hoag is accused of stealing Tablet" from Yordles Assembly.

A letter to Mason from Carrie Kinney explains that the last Tablet to America from the Master, a copy was sent to N.Y. by Mrs. Drug, but I was asked to send copies to Wash. Chicago & San Francisco.

Khanum was not well today. A long letter from Anne Apperson Flint - One from Lady

de Lafrel - All is in upset condition.

26 March Sunday.

This morning Shoghi Effendi arranged for carriage to take Mason up the mountain to see about plans for Masjid el-Azhar and other buildings. Miss Rosenberg, Rouhaniyeh Khanum, Lotfullah and I went too. We drove to Monastery on Point then up past Hotel to grounds where we went for picnic.

8 years ago Mason treated to coffee at the Inn. The morning was very pleasant. Returned at 12:30. In afternoon walked up to Tomb with Mason. Dreyfus + Lady Blomfield left this morning for Damascus - going in auto by Beirut.

Rouhi Effendi has gone to Cairo to study Arabic until fall session of school, either in America or England.

Letters from Zie Kl - wanting her to go to Siroglie Sp. who is in Switzerland - Then a letter from her husband wanting to come to Europe.

June 2 - Friday

All week M.K. has been down in spirits, more fever, but no attacks. Cooler it has been but today warmer. Last Friday Frau Lamsberger left for home. We have missed her. Hope to see her again. Wednesday - for a few moments spoke with D. about Menev K. Auntie comes every ev. now and seems to enjoy being here. No letters,

June 3 - Sat.

Census Lohaus came but we have not seen him.

June 4. Sund

Whitsuntide. With Franlein Lohaus, an German teacher, M.K., Auntie

and I walked up to Waldsee -  
and had tea. Such a crowd.

June 5. Monday.

Have not seen, Cousin B. - strange  
Fran arrived this noon, but we  
did not see her. We went into  
Schlöss Park with Fraulin H.

At 9:30 the doctor told us  
Mrs. ? had called at 6 P.M.

June 6. Tuesday.

This noon about 11 - they  
came to see Mamsel -

June 7. Wednesday

They ever they sent for us to go to  
Kurhaus, where they had friends.  
We remained until 10:30. Coming  
home we heard the nightingales  
for first time.

June 8. Thursday.

Sent a box of candy to Mrs  
S. Went down town with Aunt  
this eve Mr & Mrs S. came - then  
asked us to go to Kurhaus as  
the blind doctor was alone.

I had talk with him - He  
said he would cure me - for  
me to drink coffee after  
dinner. He tried to see me  
in the part - but did not see  
early - he says he will  
learn English in a few  
weeks so as to speak to me when  
next I see him.

ex - 1230 for 2 -

I am not sure of his powers.  
He shall see. Cousin Fran  
Schwarz all much taken.

June 9. Friday

Very hot - Went to bed at  
noon, too tired to eat.

June 10. Sat.

Fraulin H. came in eve.  
Auntie not so well - Has not  
been down.

June 11. Sunday

Wrote letters afternoon. Until  
1 - this noon there was a  
supper on balcony below and  
I could not sleep. As the doctor  
& wife of manager were present  
we could say nothing - Very  
tired. Fraulin Kottman came  
to go walking, but M.K. has a  
cold, so we remained in and  
knitted.

June 18. Sunday

Not much happened. Usual  
daily lessons - A letter from  
K. Leyard suggesting her coming  
to Rome this winter & having  
an apartment, I to be with  
her. It would be well for the  
Cause - a good service. It  
will solve some of my problems  
Sat. 17 -

Yesterday we went down town



with Fraulin to do some shopping - Bought a coffee pot to make Express - etc. Consul & wife are here. He arrived last night, she at 1 P.M. today. Returning from town Auntie and I sat down in Park. C. S. came along, and soon his wife. They did not call on M. K. Tomorrow is important day here.

Today it rained hard, but let up so that the Opelletta was given in the Park. We did not go out, Mrs. S. came, also Dr. To talk about our going to Black Forest. We hope to decide tomorrow. M. K. Hedyard & said I would like the plan she suggested, Auntie feeling better.

19 June - Monday.

Went to Bank with Auntie - good exchange - 6 1/2 lire for 100 marks. Sterling here @ 1400 - I lost. Took last German lesson today. Fraulin leaves this evening.

Went down with her after her lesson with M. K. - and did some errands. At nine we went to station to say goodbye to her. She is a very kind person. Frau Schwarz left

today and did not see her again.

20 June - Tuesday.  
Yesterday that I had lost my diamond necklace - could not find it in room - In afternoon went to Porter, and he said a guest had picked it up in the Hall. I could not get it in the Office then, so went in the evening - then the Porter said that the man wanted a reward -- to be given to the help in Kumbrau. I asked the Porter to ask him what he wanted. When he found it was an American he said 5% of value, & that it was worth 150,000 Marks. Imagine! I could not see him, but today the Porter suggested that Consul Schwarz attend to it - It seems he saw him in ex, and told him a few things. He came to see M. Kamm, and when they came up from the Dr's room he shook to me - very jolly - Auntie had come in worried too. Her husband had said she must go - C. Schwarz said he would have someone phone to him. They have now left the reward to me. I would prefer giving it to the help in Laase.

21 June Wednesday  
Much warmer. It seems Consul

Schwartz invited Monser K. to dinner today. She went to dentist & returned too tired - I was not asked. Queer politesse here! Frau & Frau Herrigal came on Monday to call, and yesterday also. They are very sincere and kindly - are here as guests of the Schwarz. We cannot get settled on where we are to go in Black Forest. All hanging fire now toward for another place C. S. has planned it was to.

22 June Thursday.  
Answer fr. Hundseck in Bl. Forest and we are to go there. Per. in Hotel Plattik 240 to 280 fr.  
Have given 2450 to 49 persons employed in Hohenlohe - extra.  
Cons. Schwarz invited Mr. Chan. to the Concert last night. When he came he found me at table and most avidly asked if the ladies were ready. I did not answer but when he was ready to go he turned to me - and I said - O, no. I am not dressed for the concert. etc - did not get an invitation. He felt very much confused. Such carelessness must be noticed. He is most generous, but I feel there is a little undercurrent - wh. I cannot quite

understand - also the doctor of late. They did not want us to come to Stuttgart, and to make the long trip fr. 4 a.m. to 6 p.m. Frattler asserted my opinion, and that did not please the doctor. I shall be glad to become indep. don't like it to receive obligations. We leave tomorrow for Stuttgart at 6.48.

23 J. - Fri.  
Arr. at 1 P.M. late. Walked fr. Station to Continental Hotel - very tired. Had lunch then slept. Went out at five and shopped with Auntie. Tele. Frau Hauff. Margie & Johanna are at seaside.  
Lovely trip from Mergentheim - beautifully cultivated - all green - a great scarcity of horses is most noticeable everywhere. So few here in Stuttgart - even few autos in streets. All seems so serious.

24 June. Sat.  
Frau Hauff called at 9:30 - Very kindly. Insisted on going with us to shop. Took us to place where I got a fine traveling and rain coat for 300 M. & to 224 lire. Found a nice Gerbedung blue dress for 3950 - what I will need this winter. It is difficult -

stopping with a number. Things are not so cheap here as when Mason came a year ago - cramped all over.

Find a strong spirit of prejudice for foreigners. Today the Minister of Foreign Affairs was shot in Berlin by two masked men. Great trouble. Silicia has separated herself from Germany. Each fresh trouble makes them sterner.

What is coming! The Poles in Hotel tonight said that the moment France is alone (= if she breaks with Germany) the Germans will finish her. It is dreadful to think of the hatred existing... People are so curious about us - seeing Mr. Khanum.

25 June - Sund.

This morning went to Wilhelmina Schloss - a small villa all in Moorish architecture and finishing - quite old. Gardens are wonderful. Reizenstein Palace was not open - we lunched in a garden with special attention for a large omelette - no bread - nice lettuce salad and cup of coffee - I paid 40. m. m. all equal to 280 lire about 15 cents. Mrs Hauff came to see us. She is very plain and kindly. We expect to go to Hotel Platteg in

Freudenstock — Stuttgart.  
Baden. They phone 240 to 280 M.  
but have written 300 to 340 M.

26 June Mond.

Met Frau Schwarz to shop with M.K. We were to leave at 1:05. I went to see the blind dealer with Frau J. He told me I should be more alone, eat slowly, take coffee after dinner; have help in study with the work, and above all should not go to mt with M.K. - where she might get pneumonia; also we should not remain in G. long as there are to be pr. disturbances. Saturday, the Minister of Foreign Affairs was killed and revolution is feared. How was I to change affairs when it was 11. A.M.

Returned after talking to Frau J. and thinking M.K. must see a nerve specialist so that she would be more certain & he would advise her. She determined to do this, and so we changed. We did not know where we would go, but Frau Lauff knew of a Pension in Freudenstock - he telephoned, got rooms there for three and will go tomorrow at 3:35. My bag was checked tickets bought etc - all changed. Shows all day. Neger & Johanna Hauff are at the sea in north Germany. They went by auto with friends. All over this will be a cool summer.

Freudenstock - Schwanwald.

27 June Tuesday

Slower. Left Stuttgart at 3:35.  
Fran J. at station - much "baggage".  
changed train at Oettingen - waited 1/2  
hour - arrived at 6:05. On the  
train was a young German who  
had been in Am. ten years.

The Hotel Continental in Stuttgart  
cheated in every way - the food  
waste and the Porter. I was as-  
tonished, I bought a rain and  
traveling coat for 3 and  
a good blue <sup>wool</sup> dress for 32.00.  
Not cheap but reasonable. - We  
could not find a man from  
Fraulein Myers, so managed  
to get a man with a one horse  
chaise. Behind this he trailed  
a station wagonette with our  
baggage, - and so we arrived  
at Haus Schaeffer. - Pleasant  
people. - Auntie and I in a double  
room tonight - M.K. - a single  
room at rear - much fun.

28 June Wed.

Grace is said. - A bell rings  
to call attention. - Not much  
friendliness. Fraulein R  
is very pleasant. - Did not  
walk - wrote some letters -

Letter from Georgia forwarded

from Plating saying she  
would not come etc -

29 June Thurs.

Wrote 8 letters today. Did  
not go out. Meals very good  
here. Yesterday moved into  
next house until there will  
be a vacant room. Pleasant  
fare here. Telephoned to  
Mergenthaler - Porter - astonished  
we were here.

30 June Frid.

Wrote 8 more letters. We went  
to Oberamt and had to pay 300  
M. - Had tea in a nice little Cafe.  
Tomorrow postage goes to  
6 M. Ausland - 3 Deutschland.  
3-50 p.e. "

1 July. Saturday.

Wrote and sent my 2  
Ex. to Fraulein Holloman -  
At 4 P.M. we all three took  
a walk in the woods. It is  
lovely! The trees are dense pine  
& firs - Air splendid.

2 July Sunday.

Studied hard today, M.K.  
& I walked up the hill in  
the woods. - lovely. - Let  
bro't memories of past tramps  
- flooding my mind with  
reminiscences.

3 July - Monday.

Leved, studied some. Aunt  
custom at table. Fraulein Meyer  
rings the bell - all as still -  
and she says a Grace - always  
the same. Rained hard tonight.

4 July - Tuesday.

Letter from Fraulein Hollmann  
with returned lessons, also  
a small German Dictionary.

Went to Bank with M.K.  
Pound Sterling 1900<sup>00</sup> = Dollar 415.  
I got only 1285. - We went  
shopping, found some nice  
sweaters - for 680 m. woolen.  
By 5 or 6, also one for Toba K.

In afternoon we went again

5 July - Wed.

Auntie not well today - indi-  
gestion I think - Knitted,  
sewed & studied. Took a long  
walk alone - It is beautiful here.  
Wanted like to take an auto trip  
to the Schwarzwald.

9 July Sund.

No news all the week. It  
has rained, thundered and  
between times the sun has  
shone. Have studied, knitted  
written letters. M.K. seems  
brighter the past few days. Have

just returned from a 1/2 walk alone.  
to get warm. The people in the  
Pension seem to soften up a bit.  
Finished rereading "Hippopotamus" in  
the night" etc. recalled Mrs - who  
was a student in Melau and returned  
on same ship to Am in 1897. He said I  
reminded him of Bernadine - I cannot now

10 July Mond.

Sun came out. M.K. is  
resting for a few days as Auntie  
and I were going down town. As

walked into the woods, then  
up to Friedrichswhol and  
had a good cup of tea. Coming  
back the path that bro't us back  
from lodgings - Having queer  
dreams - trying to get away & get  
Ella ready.

11 July Tuesday

Cloudy, cool. Studied. took  
a lesson yesterday from Fraulein  
Fritz who has just arrived fr.  
Frankfurt. Too hot - too a week.  
At 4 - M.K. & Auntie & I walked  
up to have tea again - Evening  
we had games after dinner. Rained  
very hard - Heavy spirits these  
days -

16 July Sunday.  
Raining - cold. Wednesday  
with Fraulein Fritz we went  
to Hotel Stockinger for tea.

Thursday a letter came from  
Ahmed Yazdi Effendi Jr. Geneva  
where he had just arrived.  
Expected to come on - immediately  
after a day in Milano. - No news  
since. M.K. is much upset -  
looks badly. Has telegraphed to  
Geneva, now we have written  
to Carlo Milano. It is strange

Cloudy. We went to Stockinger  
for tea.

19 Wed.  
Stormy. Asked Fraulein to  
Diele to tea. Auntie came - a  
short walk after.

20 Thursday  
We all went to Baden Baden  
on the "Rubber Neck." A wonderful  
drive between the forests and hills  
- thru interesting valleys and  
old quaint towns. At B.B. we  
took a carriage & drove for an  
hour. Lovely residences - a continuous  
garden. Sun came out lovely &  
warm - just pleasant day. Could  
not but think of Amy Harris who  
used to come to B.B. Wonder where  
she is? Took us from 9. A.M. to  
11:45 to go. With 15 min stops  
at an inn. Came back by  
Dehors Eisenstein - Left at 4:25  
arr. here 7:25. = 22 in auto.  
It cost, the trip 395 Marks. At  
present exchange not a dollar. But  
I got only 250, so it cost me  
over a dollar. Luncheon 85 M.  
& the drive 95 a piece - Less  
than a train ride that length.

21 July Friday  
Pleasant. A letter from K.  
Ludyard. saying she wants to come  
to Rome in Nov. rather Europe.  
Wants me to go to Clairvaux with her

but M. K. advises going in Spring. Wants me to be with her, help her as a friend companion. She pay all living & travelling expenses. Have a place for people to come for the teachings. I answered I would do this.

Wonder what Auntie will think! I can help her more.

22 July Saturday.

We had tea at Friedrichs turn yesterday. Auntie not feeling well. Think we need more nourishment. Flowers today all the same. Stopped with Auntie.

30 July Sunday

No news all week. weather rather cool, much rain. Today we were invited to tea at Frau Vitelini - a daughter of <sup>Wils</sup> has a shop here. The husband are Bohais. Frau Hermann was there also - Ahmed Effendi M.K. did not go.

Today a picnic was planned - for Auntie - Mrs. Fritz & Mr. Rausand - started at 10. I had some letters to write - and had finished at 11:35 so started alone. Past Friedrichs Turn - 10 min - very roads,

Germany

but kept asking of passengers. Finally I reached <sup>to find</sup> only M. K. Hanum, Ahmed Effendi and the boy. It took me one hour. We kept waiting for the others, but until 2:20 when they came joyously along - saying they had mailed two letters by the way for us. We camped under the trees, had coffee with our dry Cawcheon napped, and got back at 8:30.

31 July - Monday

Was leaving our tea in the garden when telegram arrived from Edna True saying she would be here tomorrow. Went to cinema to see Frederick the Great. Well put on.

Aug 1 - Tuesday

Edna True arrived this morning from Stuttgart. She insisted on our going to Baden Baden with her by auto. With difficulty we finally got an auto for 5000 marks. (Exp. today 6.50) We all had tea at Waldsee - then at 6:15 started. Just as we were getting into machine, her girls that she is taking thru Europe - passed by - en route to B.B. where she was to meet them. Such a

3 Aug. Commenced milk

coincidence. We arrived after a hasty ride of 1 1/4 hours. Beautiful always! Had dinner rested returned and reached here 11:30. Fine chauffeur.

2 Aug. Wed.

Rested. Talked much with Fraulein Fritz about Cause.

3 Aug. Thurs.

At 9:30 - Fraulein F. and I started for 3 mile walk to find milk. After an hour we reached the place. Fr. F. enquired at a house near the road, and finally had arranged for 3 litres a day, and found a boy to bring it in for 6 m. a day. Milk 11 a litre. Walking back we picked poppies, blues and margarites. All came to my room. at 4. Friends of F. came today.

4 Aug. Frid.

went to Kleber for coffee. Herr Roslund with us. Auntie did not feel well so did not go. Miss B. took our pictures. Ahmad Yazdi Effendi left for Smitzstand to see Skopli Effendi.

5 Aug. Sat.

Auntie rem. in room, not feeling well, I did not go to

Federichsturne with the others. Went to Otho's house after dinner. Frau - Fritz showed gifts upon me, I was so thankful for true friendship.

6 Aug. Sund.

Lovely day. At 2:30 we started in Poreak - for Kniebis - the highest point around here. Skiing there in winter. Lamm Hotel quite renowned. Herr Roslund managed to come. - Two English friends of Fraulein, M.K. - Olga and I. - Very jolly crowd. Had tea there - walked the log etc - returned at 8 P.M. No milk all day - boy did not come.

7 Aug. Mond.

Fritzi left this morn at 11:30. She was very sad last night - telling of her life, her operation etc. I pray that she may find comfort in the teachings Pauline

8 Aug. Tuesday.

No milk coming, so yesterday I had dinner at Hotel Rappan - cooking fine - fish, beans, carrots, salad potatoes + coffee - all 128 m. - But today I am enquired to house - bladder attack.



9 Aug - Wed.  
Still no better - except as I  
remain quiet and don't  
hot water. Long declaration  
from Fritz - She may come on  
Thursday with her sister.  
Telegram came tonight - saying  
she arrives tomorrow.

(Com. break at Mainz) 10 Aug. Thurs.  
Still in house - About 7:30

Thirty years today since J.K. and I were married in Auntie's front room on Leary St. San Francisco. - What changes have come! J.K. gone! Uncle gone! Grandmother & grandpa both gone - even the house gone, destroyed by the Big fire of '06! Auntie and I in Germany!! The old outlook upon life changed, hardly a vestige of resemblance to past days remains! And in the years to come - - more changes. Thirty years ago today we saw Emily, John and Mrs. Howell in San Jose. - How little I thought or contemplated what the future would bring. - How many years more! Not too many I trust - Let my work be done quickly and the mystery solved as soon as possible. This world holds but little of interest.

18 Aug. Frid.

Miss Hauff and a Miss Horn (German) from America came from Stuttgart today to see M.K. - Miss H. one of Mason's children, very friendly with Carrie Kinney & Juliet. Cool but clear today. We lunched at Rappan, then tea at Diele.

19 Aug. Sat.

No 'Hallo!' from M.K. today. A card fr. A.Y. that accidentally while in market place in Dauterbach he had seen Roubi Effendi. This news came Thursday. Today is cloudy. Met out, found M.K. walking with Fraulein Hoffo & Miss Horn. Got some papers & sawl. Envel. 50 m. for 50 = 3 1/2 lire, about 20¢ for 50. very nice ones. A letter from Auntie - She seems not too pleased, altho comfortable. Had lunch at Rappan - Later we went to Diele for coffee. Fraulein Hauff & Miss Horn went to Stuttgart.

20 Aug. Sunday.

Wrote some letters - D. came. Found me better, but still some inflammation, which I feel - Must not walk much. This afternoon M.K. & I went to the woods - she in her hammock I on the ground in the sun

We talked of our plans. To go  
to Frankfurt + then Oberammergau  
the second week of Sept.

Clear and 21. Aug - Monday  
Cloudy but warm - Went to  
office and left telegram for our  
accommodations at Oberammergau  
Had such a "lazy" dinner yesterday  
dined today - Cioccolato & Kueken  
at noon. Coffee + Kueken at 5 -  
we sat in garden in market  
place. First beautiful day

22 Aug Tuesday.

24. Marzo Sabato.

Commenced to pack early. Henriette the maid arrived, so I made haste - got all my things packed, but as we wanted to go to St. Peter's tomorrow I am to stay here tonight.

25. Marzo Domenica

We arrived at St. Peter's about 9:30 - The Cardinal performed, blessed the palms and olive, then the latter were distributed to those who had seats. I got a branch. They all formed in procession, to receive a blessed branch from Cardinal, each kissing his ring, then the procession passed down central aisle, until near door, then went out side door and formed in fore by central bronze door. After responses the door was opened and the procession entered to walk up to have

mass. We walked with them then came back to Palace. I then got in auto and came out to 26.7 via Nomentano where I shall remain I hope. A meagre room, but mine!

This afternoon took Mrs Champney to Augusto to hear Arigo Serato - violinist - very good. Sig<sup>re</sup> Pallenberg not well.

26. Marzo Lunedì.

Went in to Palace to return tickets - Catherine L. not in. No letters at Cooks. Saw Mrs Champney

27. Marzo Martedì.

Put things around in my room a little. Went to Mrs C. after lunch we bought a frame and belt and she is to make me a hat - cost less than 5<sup>00</sup> with a fancy pin. A long letter from Shoghi Effendi to all Assemblies - - this to copy. Letter from Fugita saying May Maxwell is to arrive there, also Azizullah Khan. Mr Dreyfus there. Forba Khanum arrived from Cairo - not well.

28 - Mercoledì.

Mrs C. came with hat complete. Saw Kale for a few moments.

went to Augusteo to hear solemn Mass by Beck - with Swiss chorus of 300. Very monotonous voices. very long. Should like to hear it given with smaller chorus. Clerical played by a lady.

29 Marzo Thursday.

Monday last went with Sgt Antenberg to visit a meeting held in via by - such hard work to find it - got to Salvation Army quarters. Also got into a house that was evidently kept as a convenience to immobility. Finally found the place - a few women being taught the Bible by it does not seem possible to work with the close bound church people.

Today saw Mrs Champney. Called at Sig<sup>ro</sup> Orlando but not at home. Left card at her sister's. It rained!

Rem. here all day. Saw the museum, rich in Grotto & Campino. Went to Assisi - wonderful church of St. Francis. 2 churches, over over the other. Grotto frescos - life of St. Francis. Church of Santa Chiara - who followed St. Francis - Her body is in cathedral after name, where Clarissa nuns are - The cross that spoke to St. Francis is shown here. The Duomo has paintings of Melchizedek & statues. The nun with face covered by black veil, shows St. Chiara's body, also cross. We drove to St. Maria degli Angeli - where St. Francis lived, the small hut, and also church that was near, built of stone, renewed by St. Francis are built over in the present Cathedral. The via Uccella and old gate are relics of the gilded past.

13 Apr. Sat.

Left Perugia for Siena. Over rolling hills. Ronzi, the chauffeur got off the road, much to the south & west, so that we did not arrive until five P.M. - etc

Miss Mills & Miss Kay also spent months at Palace, Rome. ~~at~~ at Cartimetal. Mr & Mrs Mc Lelain of Embassy we met again. She asked me to call. Most interesting here, would like to remain longer. We arrived in Florence at 5: P.M. for tea.

Drove to Tusole, this aft - and on to San Lorenzo, back another way. Passed morning in Uffizi.

18 Wed.

I rested - then called on Signora Cipolletti, but she was not in so came down to Hotel this eve. Shopped much with Mrs Collins

19 Thurs.

Took Signora Cipolletti & grandson for drive & then had tea with her. Mrs Co. bought some of the emb. stud - done by ladies.

20 Friday -

Started at 9:45 for Perugia. arr. at 4 P.M. Rainy. Saw Cathedral again. Mrs C. & I drove to Monte Lucce mayolica place to get another fav. - not such variety.

Siena.

Lunch in car. Shopped after arriving. Rained nearly all day, also all last night.

14 Apr. Dom.

Got up early & had a bath. We went to Mass in the Duomo. This is a special Festa of the Madonna - of the Miracles. Children are blessed, Orvieto blessed - the altar was ablaze with candles. Mass was sung, and the people here were just not as in St. Peter.

15 Apr. Lunedì.

Raining. Visited the museum at Duomo - very interesting. This Duomo was to be much larger but the plague broke out and it was never completed. It is perhaps the most richly decorated of any church. In the library are splendid things of Perugini.

We started at ten for Florence. Rained nearly all the way. We visited yesterday, the house of Santa Caterina the saint, who united the church of Cortina to Rome the Papal seat - again

Started from Perugia in a wind storm - clouds of dust - disagreeable all day. Arrived at Orvieto at 3:30. Had tea then walked forth. Today is a Festa Fascista.

Left Orvieto about 10, arrived at Rome 3 P.M. - Raining today. Stopped and had our luncheon above a lake. And today finished a wonderful twelve days trip - I feel much lighter of spirit. At Florence met Mrs. Turnbull who said that Mrs. Mendell had said that Mrs. Kedyard was going to Perugia. She gave me her Paris address. Feel rather strange to be alone!

Lunedì 23 Aprile.

At 9:30 met O. Cooke. Found cable saying "Wait" from Moore K. Also a letter from her written before my letter reached her. She mentioned writing to Cath. Letter from Azizullah who has arrived at Adifa with a wife. Fugita writes that May Maxwell is to arrive. Mrs. Schlacher & Mr. Dreyfus have gone to Bagdad

Had luncheon with Mr & Mrs Collins, then they left at 2 P.M with Renzi in auto, for Naples - to leave Wednesday on Santa Alighiere. After I left them I went to call on Miss Hedge. It came about so that I asked her what had happened between her and Mrs Redford. She then told me how Catherine had been to see her and demanded an invitation to a ball given by Mrs Leibel. That she had not acted like a "lady" and spoke of various things she had noticed. Cath. told me she had asked for the invitations to the tea that we got. Miss H. said she did not. She asked for the ball. Post Catherine! A letter from her - his - telling me she was going to Pisa and then to Florence - this I would know when I arrived in Rome.

24 April Tuesday

At looks found cable "Come immediately. Shoghi took telegraphic Collins at Naples that I would leave May 4<sup>th</sup> on Esperia. Thinking over feel I must go as

soon as possible.

25 April Mercoledì.

Find I can leave Prindisi on Saturday, arrive Alex Monday & Raju Wednesday. This aft. Sig. Pallenberg came with me - I went to Blue mans to sugiere about a room for Tooba Khanum - then we had tea. Young clerk at Sebati said he would pay the 200 lire. Am sure he knew about it, but I did not pretend to know. Got my ticket \$20 - on steamer II class. First on train, but no sleeper.

26 April Giovedì

Packed and afternoon went down to get necessary things. Afternoon to see came Gen. Piola Caselli. He gave me a letter for Strophiteffendi - Sig. <sup>me</sup> Top 10 - Sig. Vardi e Corci, later Sig. of Cairo. Sig. Tomi came in this eve! Packed until after twelve and wrote letters.

27. Apr. Venerdì

At looks this morn found letter fr. Poldo, with 75<sup>00</sup> + from Humboldt 50<sup>00</sup> - Letter from Mrs Collins - French - Ella. Sig. Sardi came to station. We left bags in car for a moment, returned to find my black hand bag

London, last Wednesday, with
