DEARLY LOVED FRIENDS,

The National Spiritual Assembly has recently received reports that in some cases childrenÂ's classes are being supervised by solitary adults.

The National Assembly is very concerned about this, and has decided for child protection and general safety reasons that this practice should no longer continue. With immediate effect, therefore, there must be two persons who are legally adults (ie at least eighteen years of age in England, Northern Ireland and Wales, sixteen years in Scotland) present and immediately available at all children A's classes. This number is, of course, the minimum necessary and larger classes will require the presence of more adults.
