#### REFUSE TO SELL SHIP TO COL-ORED PEOPLE

Several weeks ago a wealthy colored man who had risen to the rank of captain on one of our government ships conceived the idea of buying one of the vessels which the government had advertised for sale. When the deal was about to be closed, it was discovered by the government that the purchaser was a colored man, and the sale was off. Editorially speaking of the incident, the San Francisco Chronicle says:



If the fourteenth amendment to the United States constitution means anything at all, it means that the policy adopted by the shipping board is contrary to the letter and the spirit of the law. There does not appear to be any just ground for discrimination against the Negroes in the allocation of the shipping board vessels. In the case referred to, the board makes no attack on the reliahility of Captain Harry Dean, nor does it question his financial ability to take over one of its ships. It very plainly states it is a mere matter of color.

Having accepted the colored race as citizens of the United States, the Federal Government can hardly deny them any of the rights and privileges of citizenship and maintain a reputation for consistency. Treating the subject "courteously" does not alter the conditions. When "advisibility or "inexpediency" hinges on a question of color only there is bound to be the conviction that the elements of fairness and justice are lacking.
