Of the oil bill, the Commissioner of Indian Affairs is reporting as stated in Committee hearings, that the BUREAU IS FORCED TO COMPROMISE. He does not say with whom.

A powerful oil lobby seems to be working unceasingly to secure the passage of H. R. 9133.

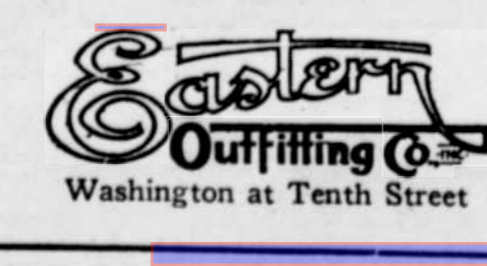
