A talk by Abdul-Baha to Dr. wetsinger on Economy. From Mirza Ahmad'Sohrab's Diary, August 24, 1914.

Dr. E. C. Uetsinger left today for America. During the day he met the Beloved several times and each time the daster spoke with him in great length. Economy was the subject of his merning's talk with him.

"Economy" He said, "is the foundation of human prosperity. The spendthrift is always in trouble. Prodigality on the part of any person is an unpardonable sin. The fewer the habits the better for the man. It is a divine virtue to be satisfied with very few things. Content

Contentment is the antidote for the cure of all the social diseases. must live an independent life and never live on others, like a parasitic plant. Every person, whether literary or manual, must have a profession and live a clean, manly, honest life, an example of purity to be imitated Contentment is the master key to all successes. If the by others. members of my family starve, I will not ask money for the people. It is more kingly to be satisfied with a crust of stale bread than to enjoy a good dinner composed of many delicious dishes, the money of which comes out of the pockets of others. Just at this time it is simply impossible to get money from any source. Yet for the last threedays I have applied to many people and finally succeeded in borrowing a sum for thy traveling expenses. Iwould not have done this for any Persian sahai nor for any one belonging to my own household. A Bahai must be There was a time that I lived on five cents a day, very satisfied. and I was then much happier than I am now. The Persian Bahais often live in the utmost poverty and want, yet they never complain nor ask for money from any one. Begging they consider below their spiritual station. A man who is the beneficiary of the treasury of the Kangdom is not poor. There have been some rich Bahais in Persia whose properties have been entirely confiscated. Being thus reduced to utter destitution, they went out cheerfully to work and in their turn spent all they made for the maintenance of the poorer Bahaif families. Love, yes, love must be demonstrated through deeds. Love has never been a passive noun; a figure of speech, but it has always been an'active noun', an ideal reality. The sign of true Faith is the service of the believers of COD, and service must always manifest itself in loving deeds and actions. - - - - - The mind of a contented person is always peaceful and his heart is at rest. He is like a monarch ruling over the whole world. A small business with a steady income is better than the wild helter-skelter speculations of the financiers. How happily such a man helps himself to his frugal meals. How joyfully he takes his walks and how peacefully he sleeps."

The Justice of GOD is a difficult subject and requires much reflection moon our lord's Words. First to know the meaning of Justice; it is not equality, but the giving to every one according to his right. People think it means equality; but it does not mean that one deals with a learned man in the same way as an ignorant man is dealt with. To deal in the same way with an enemy and a friend, is not justice; nor to deal with an animal and a man in the same way. The meaning of Justice is to give what is due to such o one, and to deal differently with the learned and ignorant.

One of GOD's Names is the "Doer of Justice" and also the "Doer of Favor. There is a great difference between these two Names. The meaning of Justice is reward and pu ishment, when either one is due to the person

wo whom it is rewarded.

wavor is giving to a person more than is his right. As we see that Ast tributes and Names of GOD are different, this shows that all stations has be different for different persons. Some men receive favor, some justice. It would not do for all contingent beings to be mineral or animalm or vegetable, or for all to be man.

For instance, it is not rossible to be given all eyes; we must have ears, nose, legs, etc., If man were only an eye, perfection would not

become visible in him.

When we consider that God has made a stone to be a stone, a man to be a man, ste., has God shown oppression to a stone because it is not a man? God has given according to capacity. He has created man with nails and eyes. Can a nail say. I am oppressed because I am not an eye? Can the foot say, "O God, Thou hast not shown mercy because I am not the brain?" God has given according to station. The contingent world is a sign of the Kingdom and Dominion of God. Consider the material kingdoms. PARACLETE.

Paraclete means the Holy Spirit, the abundance of which is manifested through every one, giving ease and comfort. But the Center of thi of this Spirit is the Blessed Perfection, Baha'0'llah. As the center of all lights is the sun, all others beings but rays of its abundance, thus those who receive the bounty are partakers of the Holy Spirit but not centers of t the Divine Apperarance of the Manifestation thereof; for example, a lamp gives light, the torch also, thestal stars saine and the moon beams, but the center of the source of their light is the sun and through its power are the they able to shine, receiving through it their rays!

THE BEADS ... Regarding the use of the beads; The object lies not in the beads. but in their number - ninety-five- for in reckoning the numbers according to the customs of the Orient, One (Wahid) amounts to nineteen and the meaning of "wahid" is the oneness and singleness of the Infinite Essence. * Know, verily, man before reaching (spiritual) maturity, merelypassas his days, and apprenents only trivial things, which are clear on account of their exoteric indications; but when he attains full development, then he grasps the reality of things and their esoteric facts. Every day after maturity is equivalent to o one year before it, on account of (man's) perception, understand ing, apprehension, and discoveries.

"I desire every Bahai to be severed and detatched. If he passes between two mountains of gold, he must not look to either size. These souls who have entered under the shade of the Blessed Perfection must show such independence as to astonish the people of the world. If men come to them with money and supplicate thom to acceptib, they must

reject it.

*Up to the time I was thirty-two years old. I never slept in a bed, prefering always a piece of mat, and as a sushion I chose one or two books. I went to sleep without changing my dress, fearing that it will take me some time to dress in the morning. But now I cannot do these things. When I lived in Acca, generally I kept ten secretaries busy ,- often dictating important letters to three at the same time .

"Thou hast written what thou shouldest do and what prayer should thou offer in order to become informed with the Mysteries of God. --- Pray thou with an attached heart and supplicate thou with a spiret stirred by the Blad-tidings of God. *After my return from American and Europe, owing to the difficulties of the long voyage and the innumerable inconveniences of the journey, a reaction set in and I became sick. Now through the favor and Bounty of the Blessed Perfection I am feeling better, - therefore I am engaged in writing to thee this letter, so that thou mayest west realize the friends of God are never forgotten under any circumstance NOW IS THE TIME THE BELIEVERS OF GOD MAY IMPEATE THE COMDUCT AND MAN-NER OF AMDULABANA. Day and night they must engage in teaching the Cause of God- but they must be imbued with the same spiritual state that Abdul-Baha manifested while travelling in America. When a teacher delivers an address, first of all his own words must have a supreme and powerful effect even upon himself, so that everyone in turn may be affected. His utterances must be like unto the flame of fire, burning away the veils of dogmas, passions and desire. Moreover, he must be in the utmost state of humility and evanescence.

that others may be miniful. He must have attained the station of remunciation and assimilation. Then and not until then will ne teach the people with the Eslody of the Supreme Concourse. "The duty of the believers of God is to be the servants to each other and attend to e. a others wunts. I am the Servant of the friends of god . "

"Thenever any soul explains any matter, he must have authority how from the Verses of God and the fords of the surrene, either from the Boo of Akdus or other Divine Tablets. If he is seked for the proof of his statement, he must show the etxt of the Book, that is his evidence. Fiefly, stery statement and word which is not based upon the Divine Texts is not Truth. No one must listen to it. No one must interfere with it. This is the irsefragable Command. Expatiate in detail upon this sub ject in every meeting.

Regarding the statement, "I am the Rose of Sharon and the Lily of the Valley," by this is meant that, just as the sweet fragrances of the roses and lily are diffused with the utmost delicacy and perfilmes the nostrils, so also the Divine Teachings of GOD affect the intellects, uplifts the souls, and inspires the spirits with boundless have and kiminess. For the sweet fragrances of the Heavenly Flowers are the Heavenly Teachings, Behests and Exhortations.

Regarding the Vision in the twenty-second chapter of Revelation By this is meant that the Bounty of God consists of the Water of Life which, like a river, flowes from the right side of the Almighty and

Talk given by Abdul Baha to hiss kary lesch, are lanyon, are slater, and hiss Certrude Bulkema at Hotel Plausa Chicago, on Thursday evening oct., 31, 1912, Dr. Ameen U. Fereed interpreting. Taken stenogramically by hiss Certrude Bulkema.

Yelcome, Exceedingly Velcome! When I reached los angeles and San rancisco a great commotion was set up. Creat intrest was manifested by all the newspapers, by the Universities and the Churches. The speeches were lengthy and the cause was proclaimed. Arguments and evidences were advanced, ratifyin, and valadating the Teachings of Bana'o'llah. Not e sin'le soul discring. All listened with perfect acquiescence and all were unanimous in their praises, even the ministers.

The friends of Los Angeles and San Francisco were very firm in the Covenant and Testament; they are exceedingly firm. If they should sense the least violation on the part of any person, they should him entirely for they know this is the cause of their becoming lukewarm; the cause of their being weakened; because such reorie are not occupied with manything except extinguishing the lumps which have been ignited by the Light of the Covenant for instance, the firm ones teach a person; then the Makageen go to him and they cause suspicion until they become lukewarm. There have been makageen here (in Chicago) for twenty years. What have they done? Nothing Have they been able to teach anyoody! have they been able to speak in a church! Pave they been able to address an audience! Have they heen able to make any body firm! They are doing nothing eye pt extinguish lamps which we ignite and putting such lamps out; that is all they do.

The friends in San Francisco are exceedingly firm. They do not associate in their nomes with any Nakazeen. A ceptain Nakazeen went there; no body would look at him. Nobody spoke to him. Wherever he went, they turned him away. They said: "You are not with us and as long as you are not with us, what have you to do with us?" You hast be as firm as a mountain.

Today the most important affair is firmless in the Covenant, because firmless in the Covenant wards off differences.

After Mis Hollness Christ, there were many who appeared who were intrumental in creating factions, dissinsions. It was not known as to which one was cursuing the right way. For example, there appeared one among them whose name was Mastor(7) who said that Christ was not a Prophet of Cod's Phophets. Another division was created. The Catholics who declared sens Christ to be the son of God; even they pronounced him to be Divinity Himself. Another division was created, the Protefunts - that Christ was possessed of two clements, a numan element and a divine element. In short, the religion of christ was divided; division was created and it was not known as to who was furming the right pathway, because there was no appointed Center to whom Christ referred every due, whose word was to be a Cateway. If his Hollness Christ has taken a Covenant with any soul, summoning all to cling to His yord as correct, then it would have been evident as to whit was veracity.

lecause there was no appointed book, every one declared, saying:
"le are the right payhway and the others aare not," But the Blessed
Perfection, Beha'o'llah, to ward off such dissensions, so that no interested person should create any division or belief, appointed a Central
Personage declaring Him to be the Expounder of the Book. That is, people do
not generally understand the meaning of the Book, but He does understand.
"He is the Expounder of ANY Ay Book and the Center of My Testument."
In the last two verses of the Book are revealed explicit instructions
declaring that, "after he, you should turn your attention to a distinct
Personage and whatsoewer He says is correct." And in the Book of the Coverant He said that by these two verses are meant such and such a person.

In all His Tablets and EBoks He has praised the firm ones in the Covenant and He has enathematized those who are not firm in the Covenant, and in all His Tablets He said: "Verily, shun those who are shaken in the Covenant. Verily, God is the Confirmer of the firm ones." In His prayers He has said: "O Cod! render those who are firm in the Covenant as dear. Legrade these who are not firm in the Covenant. O God! be the Protector of him and confirm him who confirms the Center of the Covenant."

Rany are the utterances regarding the Covenant, so that in the Elessed Cause, there should be no fighting in the Covenant, No one should say: "May opinion is this." No one should say: "May thought is this." That they may know who is the Expounder. Whatsoever he rays is correct. He has not left any foom for dissension — not at all. or course, it is certain that in the world there are those who are antegoristic; there are those who are followers of passion; there are antegoristic; there are those who are followers of passion; there are those who follow their own thoughts, there are those who like to create those who follow their own thoughts, there are those who is the Cause. For, example, Judas Iscariot was one of the disciples, but he betrayed Christ. Such things have happened in the past but now the Blessed Beauty has declared: "This person is the Expounder of My Book and all must turn to Him." And this is to ward off dissension.

The purpose of the Blessed one is to create not any difference. Not with standing all this, there are certain souls here and a few souls in Acca who have violated this command. For twenty years the Nakazeen My have done nothing. Have they here in Chicago? The friends must be like friends in San Francisco. When ever they sense the least violation from anyone, they should say: "Oet out of here! You must not associate with Us."

The following are reminiscences of conversations taken the same evening between the same parties but not taken stenographically.

In answer to the question by one of the four ladies as to how would be able to know a Nakazeen, Abdul Bana replied: "Would you know a donkey if you saw one?"

In further explaining the absolute necessity of keeping aloof from the Nekazeen, Abdul Bana cited the following evample: "In any army containing Tooo well men and one consumptive, the Tocof well men could never cure the one sick man of consumption, but the one sick man could contaminate the whole army of Tooo well and make every one of them sick."

one of the ladies present asked Abdul Bana to name the Nakazeen in Chicago. His reply was; *For he to make a Nakazeen, would be an everlasting condemnation against that person. It would be a black mark that would never be erased.*

All must agree in this word. until the difference of opinions may be entirely removed from their But that which is essential to the acknowledgement of this word (i.e. ABDUL-BAHA) is attraction, the Love of GOD, service to the Cause of GOD, diffusing the Word of GOD, severence from all else save GOD, affinity, union, oneness, huallity, neekless, nothingness, and Servitude to the Beloved of GOD. If one does not become characterized with these attributes, he has not acknowledged the title (or station) of ABDUL-BAHA.

Because: ABDUL-BAHA is the Banner of the Love of GOD, the Lamp of the Knowledge of GOD, the Herald of the Hingdom of GOD, the Commander of the Hosts of Peace and Reconciliation, and the Orb of Union and Harmony among all the nations of the world. Consequently, every one in whose heart the love of ABDUL-BAHA has irradiated, must act in this manner; and when persons walk and move in this path, all differ-

ences shall be removed.

O dear one! This dispensation of the Beauty of ABHA is the time of deeds, new not words. The purpose is not words, but deeds!

All the beloved of GOD must be characterized with the heavenly attributes and appear in such conduct that the Brilliancy of Merci-

fulness may pervade all regions.

Every person who is strengthened in these Heavenly virtues is my partner and associate in the service of the Holy Threshold. O dear one! All nations await two Manifestations, and these two Manifestations signify the Blessed Beauty (BAHA'U'LLAH) and His Holi-

ness the BAB. Words are different, but the purpose is one. One has called Him "MATDI", and another hath called Him "CHRIST". One hath named the Blessed Beauty the "LORD OF HOSTS", and

In order to obtain the perfect love and unity let us, during the Bahai month of Masheyat fbeginning Sepit 27 to Oct 15, inclusive,) "clasp hands and pray together, saying these wonderful words together for nineteen days, ninety-five times each day during this month-Is the eany remover of difficulties save God? Extract from a letter written by Mirza Moneer Zain, dated Acca, December 20, 1908, to Mr. Thornton Chase.

"One of the friends from the city of Hamadan, Persia, wrote us the following statement which I wish to translate and relate to you:

"The friends of God here on one night collected four thousand tomans (a toman = \$1.95) and purchased the Protestant College situated in the Israelites' square. (All the students in that college were known Israelites with a few Mohammedans and Parsecs.) The teachers endeavored for many years with an utnost zeal and effect to bring up and train the students after their own desire and to convert them into Protestant faith. The teachers and missionaries, being very jealous and fanatic people, were acting elveyr against the Cause. But from their earnest labors no result or fruit had ever been produced, i.e., none of the students accepted their teachings, and when finally they received their diplomas, to the great astonishment of the teachers and missionaries, the students unanimously excluted: "We are Bahais!"

'The teachers, finding that their efforts, labors and immense expenses all had been spent in vair and that their educated stuctors were consequently converted into Banai faith, intended to give up any further teaching and to sall the college. So the Bahais purchased the college for themselves and will soon provide it with Bahai teachers.

'In fact, the noble and refined students had to suffer and endure patiently every trial and test in the college, for they were rather forced to listen to different statements, preached to them quite against their faith and yet to keep silent.

This servant, when he was called into the holy presence of the Master, Abdul Baha, rim years ago, had the intention to relate to him in detail the grievous condition of the students of that college, but not more than a few words were submitted to Him when I heard Him uttering these words:

'Although the Protestants seem to be outwardly very jealous and against the Bahais, they are unconsciously and inwardly serving and spreading the Cause of AHA.'

"Now we realize the fulfill ent of that blessed statement uttered six years ago, for the Protestants established and organized the college, educated the students and consequently offered all to the Bahais. Glory be to His Holy Name!" Extracts of talks given by Abdul maha to the American pilgrims, sent 5 in Fugeta's letter, dated April, 24, 1920, to Mrs. Frankland.

TALKE WITH ABOUL BAHA

College College "What do you expect the Bahais to accomplish in this world?" asked a stranger. The Beloved One answered: "The Bahais must be the servants of Universal Peace, the workers for the cause of Oneness of the World of Humanity, the Spreaders of heavenly love amongst the children of men, the promulgators of the principles of the progress of mankind, the dispellers of the clouds of religious, national, patriotic and political prejudices, and the upholders of the inviolable rights of equality between man and woman.

They must correspond religious ideals with the deductions of science and reason, discard all theories that cannot stand the test of intellect and empirical knowledge. This is the work of the Bahais: Dost thou not and empirical knowledge. This is the work of the Bahais: Dost thou not like to enlist in this army? You? Then come and usher under this tent. Make thou also an effort, so that the world of humanity may attain to the highest summit of perfection. Strive that religion may be cleaned from ignorant prejudices. Strive that bias may be removed. Strive that warfare and strife may become non-existent. Strive that love and goodfellowship may replace intolerance and narrowness of dogmatism.

Strive to scatter the seeds of kindness in the hearts. These are the

teachings of Baha ullah. We are striving in this path.

His Holiness Baha'u'llah has opened a great door of interdependence of all nations before the faces. For example, the strict adherents of the present-day religious consider each other as infidels and contaminating, - as apostates in the sight of GOD and man, - as deserving to be thrown to the bottom of hell in the jaws of satan. But Baha'u'llah, addressing the world of humanity, says: 'Ye are the leaves of one branch and the fruits of one tree. "

"What is your belief as regards the origin of evil." The Blessed One answered: "There is no origin of evil. Evil is non-existent. For example, darkness is evil; it is the absence of light. Wherever there is no light, there is darkness; consequently, there is no existence of it. Poverty is the absence of wealth. Ignorance is the absence of knowledge. Evil is the absence of good. All evils are nonexistent and have no outward forms and shapes. Creation is good. the Spirit of GOD moved upon the face of the waters, and GOD said: Let there be light; and there was light. And GOD saw the light that it was good. ! "

"How can one understand the object of his life?" The Blessed One answered: "There are two kinds of understanding, objective and subjective. To illustrate: Thou seest this glass of water and thou dost comprehend in an objective manner their constituent parts.

On the other hand, thou canst not see love, intellect, hate, anger, sorrow, but thou dost recognize them in a subjective way through their signs and manifestations. The first is material: The second is spiritual.

The first is outward; the second is intuitive. I hope that thou mayest make great advancement in the second kind of understanding. Turn thy face toward GOD and say: 'O GOD, refresh and gladden my spirit; purify my heart; illumine my powers. I lay all my affairs in Thy Hands. Thou art my Guide and Refuge. I will not be grieved and sorrowful any more. I will not let trouble harass me any longer. I will not dwell on the unpleasant things of life. O GOD, Thou art kinder to me than myself.

TALK BY ABDUL BAHA. Haifa, Palestine, November, 1919

¥ For the black and white in America to associate together in a social way is good. The Government has objections on political grounds for granting equality to the blacks, but you can promote friendly intercourse with-out inte rfering with politics. Doves or sheep of different color associate witjout co flict. Why should man, who is higher than animal, observe distinctions based on color? It is not proper for man to do such a thing. Difference in color is in it self a beauty. It is so in the mineral, vegetable and animal kingdoms. If flowers in a garden were white, it would not have perfect beauty. Variety is needed. In the human world too, the white, yellow, red, brown and black, when they associate together they contribute to beauty.

The whites in America fought four years to liberate the slaves. This effect has stirred the people in Europe and the East to do the same thing. Even AXXXXX in Africa the blacks have been partly emancipated. The blacks should be grateful for these efforts of the whites. I spoke to the ... of ... in this way. They invited me to their church. There were white and colored peple there and I spoke in this way. A Jew from Washington heard this. He prepared a special meeting with white and colored all mixed together.

There is no distinction in the sight of GOD between black and white. It is the pure heart that counts, not whether the skin be yellow, white red brown or black. You ought to spread these views in America. The world of the Kingdom is a uniclored pavilion. Don't try to force these opinions upon the people if they are obstinate in their prejudice. The Kingdom is one of good pleasure, not of force. We must follow the policy of GOD and accept all who are pure.

W.R.Randall: -- The colored question in Washington and the south has become quitt acute, but not so in Boston Ibelieve it is largely due to politics of one kind or another. Will the Master suggest any plan ro solve it? ABDUL BAHA: -- "This question will only be solved thru' the Teachings of Baha'o'llah".

W.H.Randell: -- In some of the rescent race riots some white men colred themselves black to instigate thouble. ABDU BAHA.--"I knew it. These difficulties are solved by Baha'o'llah, and the Teachings of Baha'o'llah, like what I said in America in Washington. Have you read my address in Washington on the subject?".

W.H.Randall: -- Yes.

ABDUL BAHA .-- "The solution is in that way" . W.H.Randall:-- We have many beautiful colored friends in America and in Bosto ABDUL BAHA.-- From the association of the white friends with the colored friends the others, people outside the Cause will learn the Meaning".

WORDS UTTERED BY ABDUL BAHA DURING THE FEAST.

Annointing with rose water:

"Now have we, the beloved of God, gathered together to partake of material and spiritual food." "As this perfume is to the nostrils, so may spiritual fragrance refresh the soul!"

"You are in prison here - My partners in imprisonment - prisoners of love: God be praised!"

Serving the Food:

"This is a blessed Supper of the Lord, for we have gathered under the Shadow of the Blessed Perfection."

"Christ said, 'I am the Living Bread which came down from Heaven. If any man eat of this Bread he shall live forever!"

"This meeting is through the Love of the Blessed Perfection. In the sensibility of the heart is the true realization. God is Love."

*We are the lambs of the Blessed Perfection. Jesus said, 'Lovest thou Me, Peter? Feed My lambs.'

"It is prophesied in the Heavenly Books that so they shall sit down at the Lord's Table. From the east and from the west they shall come to sit down in His Kingdom."

"In the last day all the sheep shall be gathered together."

"In this manner ye shall gather together in America. Then shall the Bounties of the Blessed Perfection descend upon you. Divine assistance will be given to you, and from your meeting, the Love of God will be spread to all men."

. "Strive, strive always that ye may be united. If one single sheep strays away from the fold, do all in your power to bring it back. Kindness and Love must be your means of gathering all together!"

"God has favored us. We have gathered once more at His Table. May His Abundance and Mercy make night as day and day everlasting! For day and night are according to the conditions of this world. In relation to the sun they do not exist. To the sun, day is everlasting. If we ascend to the heavens there will be no night, no horison. The earthly things have existence: all must die. The wise man sees them as perished, sees them as non-existent, realizes their nothingness and insufficiency. But that which belongs to the Kingdom of Heaven is from everlasting to everlasting. The spiritually-open eyes of the servants of God, those who are active, alert and mindful of the Eternal Destiny, will turn to the Kingdom of Heaven because It is everlasting and is the only Reality. Consider, O beloved of God, that the outward is but the sign of the inward. How many people since the time of Christ have come and gone! How many kings, princes and celebrated men have lived their span of years, yet now no sign of them remains: no result therefore non-existence. But those who were partakers of the Diwine Cup which Christ brought - although they were looked upon as having no knowledge, and though outwardly simple and unimportant they appeared from the Eternal Horizon and forever live in the Light of the Day of God. For that which belongs to the Kingdom that which is alive in the Divine Spirit - is everlasting, while all that belongs to earth and its existence will fade away and perish."

"There are two kinds of Love: one Universal and one Individual. You must love humanity in order to uplift and beautify humanity. Even if they kill you, you must love them. Individual love cannot be forced and you are not called to love everybody $8d \pm 3a \cdot 8$

personally, but if they are in your lives, <u>see to it</u> that they are means of your development and that you are means of their development, through your universal love for them. We are creatures of the same God. We must love all therefore as children of God even though they are doing us harm. Christ <u>loved</u> His persecutors. It is possible for us to attain to that love. God manifested His Love by creating man in His own Image. Man must manifest His Love by developing himself and others in the Image of God. The true fruit of man is therefore Love. The purpose of a tree is to produce fruit. Man is like a tree. <u>His</u> fruit should be Love."

"You will send My Greetings and Love to each and all the believers in America from here. I have not much opportunity to write to them; My work is so heavy. I must look and turn to the whole world. My work is the whole world - and if I do not answer their letters - it is not that My Love does not go out-to them - it is simply that opportunity does not permit the accomplishment of My desire. To each one, and to all the believers in America, say: be a cause of happiness, be a cause of enkindlement in the Kingdom of God."

other duties claim My time. Although I do not see you, I think of you always, continually. In My heart you are ever living. I have been with the Governor this afternoon, yet My heart has been with you. The important thing is the heart and My heart is yours. That hearts should be united with hearts, spirit with spirit: this is the real existence; all else is but vanity and nothingness. God be praised that it is so. As I cannot be with you continually, the regret is deep. From God I bear witness that I wish always to be

at your side - that nothing may ever come between us - that we may continue together in the same place. So shall our spirits continue inseparable, although the bodies are widely separated by distance. To-night some of our spiritual brothers will come to the table with us and you will be with them. This is the cause of My great happiness - seeing America and the East joined together in love and spiritual unity. May all the beloved in the world be so joined, until all mankind shall come under one rule; all nations be as one family. And this will surely come to pass. It is the Will of God that we may all be perfected in the Wisdom and Spirit of the Blessed Perfection."

"You are in prison here - My partners in imprisonment - prisoners of Love - God be praised! In these times, one hour in Akka means much. There is a wast significance in these precious hours."

"The beloved in New York must be as one soul, one will, in different bodies. They must help one another as much as possible. This is the most acceptable action in the Kingdom of God. It is especially a blessed privilege to invite the beloved to share your hospitality. If possible have a general meeting every nineteen days even though it be to partake only of water and bread. In all your meetings, speak not of political questions. Concentrate your words upon the Cause of God. Do not talk about other things. Speak as you hear Me speak, saying very little about outside matters. I pray that the blessings of the Blessed Perfection may strengthen and assist you in the Cause of God. The more you are assisted in the Cause of God, the happier I will be and the more I will rejoice."

"There is something especially I wish to make you sure of. It is this: Never let your hearts be troubled or distressed by anything that may happen here. Never let My difficulties or hardships distress or affect you. If you should receive news in America that I have been thrown into the sea, or carried away by armed men to an unknown place; if you should receive word that I have been tortured, diamembered and killed, change not, grieve not;

nay, rather, be more firm, be more steadfast, whether I am in this world or not; for wherever I may be, here or in the world to come, I will always be with you, and always ask assistance for you."

CONCERNING BODY, SOUL AND SPIRIT

A talk by ABDUL BAHA in Paris, #4, Avenue de Cameens, Nov. 17, 1911. THERE are in the world of humanity three degrees; those of the body, the soul,

and spirit. The body is the physical or animal degree of Man. From the bodily point of view Man is a sharer of the Animal Kingdom. The bodies alike of men and animals are composed of elements held together by the law of attraction.

Like the animal, man possesses the faculties of the senses, is subject to heat, cold, hunger, thirst, etc.; unlike the animal, man has a rational soul, the human intelligence.

The intelligence of man is the intermediary between his body and his spirit.

When man allews the spirit, through his soul, to enlighten his understanding, then does he contain all Creation; because Man, being the culmination of all that went before and thus superior to all previous evolutions, contains all the lower world within himself. Illumined by the spirit through the instrumentality of the soul, Man's radiant intelligence makes him the erowning point of Greation.

All his aspirations and desires being strengthened by the lower side of the soul's nature, he becomes more and more brutal, until his whole being is in no way superior to that of the beasts that perish. Mon such as this, plan to work evil, to hurt and to destroy; they are entirely without the Spirit of Divine Compassion, for the celestial quality of the soul has been dominated by that of the Material. If, on the centrary, the Spiritual nature of the soul has been se strengthened that it helds the Enterial side in subjection, then does the man approach the Divine; his humanity

becomes se glorified that the virtues of the Celestial Assembly are manifested in him; he radiates the Morey of God, he stimulates the Spiritual progress of Mankind, for he becomes a lamp to show light on their path,

A BRIEF ANSWER TO QUESTIONS ON THE FULFILLMENT OF SOME BIBLE PROPHECIES CONCERNING THIS DAY.

Nineteen Hundred years ago, Jesus Christ walked the earth, but was despised, rejected and unknown to many of the religious doctors, although He was a perfect man and the One whom they exected, and for whose coming they continually prayed. On one occasion He said to the Scribes and Pharisees, the advice of the age, "Ye search the Scriptures for out of them ye think ye have Eternal Life. These also testify of me."

The reason why Jesus Christ was known to the humble layman and the very lowly people, but rejected by many of the wise and learned, was on account of the pride and arrogance of the latter, by preferring their own human thoughts and limited interpretations, to Divine conception and insight.

The Messengers of God, Baha'O'LLAH, His Greatest Manifestation, and ABDUL Abd, the Servant of God and the Center of His Governant have appeared, and the Divine Light in this "Day of God," shines with the brilliancy of the sun. The principles which they proclaim are universal and are the "healing of the nations" and "the pacification of the world." If man will accept it, these twelve great principles are symbolized by the Tree, in the Book of Revelation, bearing twelve manner of fruits, and the leaves of this tree are for the healing of the nations. These Universal principles, briefly stated, are as follows:

The Search for Truth,
The Oneness of Humanity,
The Unity of Religions,
Religion and Science Agree,
Equality of Men and Women,
Abandcament of Prejudices,

A Universal Language, Universal Education, Universal Peace, An International Tribunal, Solution of the Economic Problem, The Power of the Holv Spirit.

These principles applied to the sick body of the world will be a healing antidote for every disease.

Christ warned us against the false; as the false prophets in every cycle, were ever a veil for the True One. The false prophets against whom we were warned by Christ, were to appear in His name, and show great signs of wonders, but the True One was to come in a new name and the children of light, in these latter days, were to appear with a new name upon their foreheads. "He that is faithful and true, I will make a pillar in the temple of my God, and I will write upon him, My NEW NAME." But the new name in meaning, fulfills prophecies.

Many of the prophecies of the Old Testament, which have been thought by the divines, to apply to Jesus Christ, did not in reality apply to Him; but those prophecies are, in this day, fulfilled in the appearance of Baha'o'llah (the Glory of God) and in the coming of the Servant of God, Abdul Baha.

Isaiah - 9:6: "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given, and the government shall be upon his shoulders; and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, the mighty God, the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace."

It is very significant that Jesus Christ never claimed any of the above titles. The titles by which He preferred to be known were: "The Son of God" and "The Son of Man." His human name was Jesus. His title, "The Christ", means the annointed. He did not claim to be the Father, but He said, "the Father is in Me," meaning the Holy Spirit. He said, "I go to the Father, and the Father is greater than I." He promised that the Father would come, and bade His disciples, in the Lord's Prayer, pray for the coming of the Father. He also promises it in the parable of the vineyard, namely, that the Lord of the Vineyard would come!

Today, Baha'o'llah, in a marvelous way, fulfills all these prophecies and many others, made not only by Jesus Christ, but by all the prophets of previous cycles.

"Arise, shine, for thy Baha, (Light) hath come, and Baha'o'llah (The Glory of God) hath risen upon thee. The Baha of Glory, of Abha, (God) shall cover the earth as the waters cover the deep. "Carmel and Sharon" shall see Baha'o'llah (The Glory of God.)" All flesh shall see Baha'o'llah (The Glory of God.)"

In the same way, Abdul Baha is the "Branch of the Lord" and "My Servant, the Branch," appears in many prophecies. One of them reads: "In that day shall the Branch of the Lord be beautiful and glorious, and the fruits of the earth shall be comely because of Him. Another reads; "Behold my Servant, the Branch, He shall build the temple of the Lord." It is particularly significant that Abdul Baha directed and completed, in the Orient, the building of the Mashrak-ul-Askar. or Universal house of worship, in which all nations, races, classes, colors and religions are welcome. By His instructions, another such great temple is being erected in Chicago. The reason why people, in the various cycles have rejected the Divine Messengers when sent to them, is because they have misunderstood the symbols and prophecies of their own Holy Books. Whoever rejects Baha'o'llah, the Manifestation of God, and Abdul Baha, the Center of His Covenant, in this great day, is unwittingly condemned by the prophecies and Creative Words of the very book for which he professes faith. Bible prophecies point overwhelmingly to the Mystery of the Return and Wonders of this new dispensation. Those who profess belief in Christ, being sincere, should take all His words and promises and not reject Him in particular, for thus they deny themselves the Divine Bounty and Mercy in this day of His second appearance.

He said He would come "as a thief in the night." How would His coming be more likely to be unnoticed by people than if He came as He came before, in the temple of man, the perfect man of this cycle? Would not such an appearance be "a snare to everyone on the face of the earth?" These are only a few of the prophecies that prove the validity of the Bahai Revelation and its three Holy Messengers who have successively appeared in this day, and by whose appearance, the whole earth is filled with light.

God grant that all mankind may awaken out of their deep slumber and have "seeing eyes and hearing ears," that they may understand and find healing of their spiritual and material diseases.

In the early part of the spring of 1903, when the orange trees were all in bloom, Mrs. Emily Goodwin and myself were riding through the orange groves of Hollywood at Sunset. I happened to make the statement that the gragrance of the orange blossoms always made me think of the Christ, as I had always thought of Him walking among the orange trees in Palestine. My friend looked at me quite hard for a few seconds, then said, "My dear, do you know that it is said that He has come again and is living in Acca, Palestine at present?" For a second I was so surprised that I could not speak, then I asked how she knew this. She told me that her friend of many years, Mrs. Helen Goodall of San Francisco. had told her about four years before that, but she, Mrs. Goodwin, had not known how much truth there was in the report. I wrote Mrs. Goodall for particulars and through Mrs. Goodall was confirmed in the truth. Mrs. Goodall was my teacher: sent my letter to 'Abdu'l-Baha; gave me my first ring; and received my first Tablet from 'Abdu'l-Baha, July 14, 1903. Mrs. Goodall wrote me in a few weeks that Mr. and Mrs. Winterburn would be here in Los Angeles to live, then there would be some one to teach me. In the meantime, one day Mrs. Goodwin and myself were shopping in Los Angeles and the young lady who waited on me had to go and hunt the articles that I wanted. As she loft us, Wrs. Goodmin said, Did you notice the ring she had on her little finder?" I said, "No", but when she returned I asked her if I might see her ring. and said, "Allah'u'abha". The young lady almost jumped over the counter to take me in her arms, as she was so harpy to find some one who knew the Message, as she had just come to Los Angeles from Chicago, and was very lonesome. That young lady was Grace Rutherford, who later became Mrs. Roscoe Lamb.

In about two weeks time Mr. Chase came to Los Angeles and Mrs. Goodwin had Grace, Mrs. Chase and myself at her home in Hollywood the Sunday afternnon that Mr. Chase was here: so that was really the very first Baha'i meeting in this part of Southern California. Later, when the Winterburns came, they held the meetings at their home for several years, and through their teaching all the earlier believers came into the Cause.

Mrs. Brittingham spread the first Feast in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Winterburn.

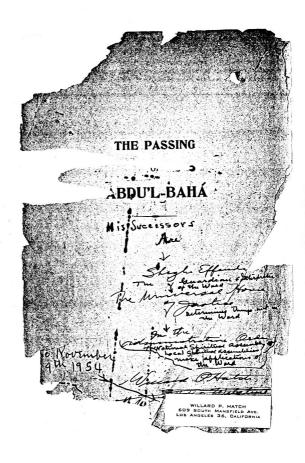

EXTRACTS FROM ADDRESS. WASHINGTON' D.C. APRIL 22, 1912.

"You are all welcome. I am very glad to see you all. I pray for you, asking God for His Infinite bountiess to descend on you all so that the veils may be rent asunder, - that you may attain to the utmost progress.

For six thousand years misunderstandings have bent humanity divided. All nations have been in a state of strife, of warfare and bloodshed. Tisunderstandings have been among the people. People have bowed to imitations. Now, praise be, a century of light has appeared, and superstition shall pass away. All seek truth in the foundations of religion, and all foundations of divine religion are one. All must be united and agreed. Veils will be torn asunder and all nations shall be united.

I said the foundations of all religions are one. But religion consists of two divisions, - lst, the spiritual and ethical, which is unchange able; and, that which deals with maturial life; this is changeable and fluctuating with the need of men; this is subject to change in every age and cycle. Cuestion: ---- *How shall I overcome seeing the faults of others- recognizing the wrong in others? *

Answer by ABDUL BANA: "I will tell you. Whenever you recognize the fault of another, think of yourself, ask yourself:
'What are my imporfections'- and try to remove (overcome) them.

Do this whenever you are tried through the words or deeds of others; thus you will grow, become more perfect. You will overcome self. You will not even have time to think of the faults of others! Man is blind yet he sees far. (laughing) Man is blind yet he sees far! That is puzzling? We are in Paris, and we see the faults of the believers in America and Stuttgart, but we are so blind that we cannot see the nose on our face! While we are blind, we have a far-sighted vision to America, to Cermeny!

Words of Abdul Baha: Two extracts from the notes of Mr. Mountfort Mills.

"Jesus was a Manifestation of God. Everything of Him pertained to God. To know Him was to know God; To love Him was to love God; To obey Him was to obey God. He was the source of all Divine Qualities. In this Mirror the light of the Sun of Reality was reflected to the world. Through this Mirror the energy of God was transmitted to the world.
