

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October "1,1926...

We arrived in Haifa on the evening of the 21st just after dark.

Oct #4...

This afternoon we visited the Holy Tomb of the Bab.

We left the Pilgrim House at 3:30 in 'Abdu'l-Baha's little Ford car.

We were received by several women believers in the little house just bedide the Tomb and there were served with Tea.

Oct 25th ...

Told by Miraza Bafi Effendi.

When General Allenb took Palestine he commanded the people of Haifa to make formal acknowledgement of the Bristish victory by calling upon him to pay their respects.

Aferwards he went tersonally to pay his resnectsto 'Abdu'l-Baha; and at the same time to show appreciation of the British Governement for 'Abdu'l-Baha's services to the poor during the war

At that time Gen. Allenby said that he was happy to call upon one who was the real ruler of the earth.

Pilgrim House, Haifa.

Oct. 25th...

When the British Government first spole of decorating 'Abdu'l-Baha, Mirza Badi, the Governer's private secretary sold: 'Abdu'l-Baha does not receive decorations from Kings, he decorates Kings However, inasmuch as he has accepted the persecution by the Turkish Government for 40 years, he will no doubt accept the honor you wish to bestow upoj him.

October :6th ...

Miss Elizabeth Stewart arrived at the Pilorin House last night from Teheran, Persia. About the same time that the Tarbiat School was established the mohammedens also established schools and now have eight or ten schools for boys and girls (severate).

The city has a Board of Education and the Tarbiat School is under the supervision of the Bos Board.

The girl's school has an enrollment of 250 pup pupils. Misss Lillian Kappes - English Teacher.

There are twelve teachers, all Baha'is but on one who is to be there but a short time.

The salaries are from 8 to IO dollars a month. They were formerly only 2 or 3 dollars a month.

Miss Kappes has obliged to do work on the outside in order to make ends meet.

At preset// physical education is taught in all the schools. It was taught in the Tarbayat several years before the Muhammedans schools adopt adopted it. The Tarbayat school is a graded school. There are seven grades. They hope to ha have eight grades next year. The girls are instructed in English.

Oct. 30.1920..Saturday..Pilgrim House, Haifa.

This afternoon we visited the Holy Tomb of Baha'u'llah. Mrs Goodall, Mrs Cooper, Mrs Ralston Rouha Khanum, Mrs Hoagg, Hovieh Khanum who is the prospective bride of Mirza Badi the private sec. of the Governor of Haifa, and also tra slator or rather, interpreter, for 'Abdu'l-Baha. Rouhi Effend and his sister Sorayah, also Fugita and Arthur Radeen, the chauffeur , went with us.

Khosro, the Incian servant of 'Abdu'l-Baha, drove the Ford and Arthur took the Cunningham.

We rode most of the way on the beach, but in places where it was too narrow for the machine we took an upper road on the soft sand over which wire had been laid by the English during the war f for the troops to pass over.

All the way along we could see Acca in the dist. tance. Even with the bad road, it took but little more than a half hour to make the trip. On arriving at Bahji we went into a small rooma adjoining the Tomb where we were served tea by Khosro and Fugita.

After tea we visited the Tomb, passing thru the beautiful garden which surrounds the Tomb.

Max we walked up the few steps which lead into the Tomb, wad before turning to walk up the isle toward the open door which leads into the Tomb proper we removed our shoes.

The experience of this visit is one that can hardly be described even by those who **haperihace** privalegeof this visit. To kneel at the Holy Threshold, to ask forgiveness, to beg to become worthy of service in the Cause of God; to pray for the unity of the friends, and strength and confirmation to go forth to serve, isigh the knowledg that these **kannking** come only through the bounty of Baha'u'llah, are some of the Heart's consciousness at that time.

On our way home we stopped at the Garden of Rizwan, owned by 'Abdu'l-Baha, to get some dates The garden which is beside the Rizwan is where the dates are grown.

While we waited the care-taker climbed up a date palm of great height and with a cycle cut off a branch hanging full of dates (gunny sacks covered each branch of dates to keep those which ripened first from falling. "ever before have I eateb anything so delicious as a ripe date firesh from the tree.

The gardner gave us many beautiful pomegra nites.

Rouh@ Khanum told us that our Lord did not use the fruits in this garden, that he kept it for the poor entirely. Everyone in Acca and Haifa kn knows 'Abdu'l-Baha, the friend of the poor.

We were all very happy as we drove home along t the beach just at sunset. The blue bay and surrounding hills were covered with a wonderful glow

As we drove into Haifa the Muhammedan women with their long black veils and the men riding their tiny donkeys, made a picturesque sight not to be forgotten. We passed several outdoor restaurants where the men were satting by small tables eating and some smoking the hubble-bubble. (water pipes)

Our big automobil almost filled the narrow streets and when Arthur sounded the horn the pedestrians flew in all directions.

We also met a caravan of camels coming in from the outside towns laden with grain etc.

Miss Elizabeth Stewart's trip from Teheran, Persia as related by her.

She left Teheran Aug.7, I92) by automobile ascompanied by Mr and Mrs New (English), their child,6 years old and two babies, twins six we ks old (twins under Miss Stewart's special care), and the chauffeur, who was somewhat interested in the Cause.

They arrived at Kaswin at five in the morning and remained iver night. From there they went to Mamadan - Hamakan is old Ecbatana of the Bible -Here they remained two days at the home od some Scotch people.

From Hamadan they drove all day and arrived at Kirmanshah, driving over the great pass Assadabed which is over IOOO ft. above sea level. The road was marvelous- made by the English, Here they remained two days at the home of an Emglish family (bankers). They were told that the Englis and the Arabs were fighting because the Arabs had torn up the road. But on the third day they let them go on to the large camp, Kerina.

There were 6000 tents at the camp - many soldiers and families,. They were given a tent a and told they would have to remain a week. They were permitted to eat with the officiers.

A large dairy was connected with the camp. Indian cows were used because they thrived best in the hot climate. Instead of being in camp one week they were there FIVE. From day to day they were told they might leave the following day. Bu it was five weeks when camp was broken up and the hed to move to another **Sixty** miles distant. He advised them saying, "You do not know, but I know what the result will be. Hear this from me; there is nothing better than this, that we should go under that flag, and repent and beg and mament, perchance God may forgive our sins!"

Gradually he satisfied them. Then he sent for the Christians, but all were hidden. He then published a notice saying: "If one of the revered Christians will come before me I will guanantee his safety and his comfort, I will guanantee absolutely.

One of the blessed and revered souls who was in reality following Christ, went to the king. After the king asked many questions and received answers he said: "If one wishes to become a Christian what is one to do?" We want to come under that flag of "hrist and announce it, so that all our country may become Christian. What are we to do?

The 'hristian said "You have repented. that that itself is faith; all your sins will be forgiven and you will enter the everlasting Fingdom. You will be cured from all illness and trouble. Command that one of the Temples be cleared and put in order; and some dat you will come to the church and pray, and then you will announce that the state religion is the religion of Christ.

The king did so. He emptied one of the temples of its idols, put it in order and place a bell therein. When the bel was rung they cried, "What does this mean?" They were told that the king had become Christian with all his family and court. The people came in Crowds to watch the king and his couptier come from the palace dressed in their roysroyal robes. When the arrived at the door of the church, the king threw his crown on the ground. All the others followed his example. Then Louis entered with the utmost humility and commanded that the prayers should be read. When he came out he said: "The st state religion is to be of Christ" His family remained Christian.

Mrs C...Is the whole wheat bread that the Master said contains all the elements necessary to the body of man?

A.B....Yes. If man had no other food he coul live well on this bread:it would be suffi cient for his health...

A.B....This is why Christ said: "I am the heavenly bread; he who eats of this bread shall never die, i.e. of this heavenly bread.

*Abdu'l-Baha told Mrs Frankland not to eat certain food on her plate as she had been ill. Mrs F..said that if she went home so thin her husband might not receive her.

A.B... Thou art accepted before God. Even the though you may be weak here, he, your husband ought to accept you. If man accepts a person at the end he will not be with him.(?)

If a man leaves this world his friends cannot go with him under the ground; he hoes only to the grave and returns. But God is everywhere with him. He will not leave him either over or under the ground.

"ever forget these days! Remember them! The more you remember them, the more spiritual you will become. Appreciate the value of these days. The cool breeze does not always Now; the rain does not always come; the crees do not always bear fruit.

Now you are in such days that the breez ϵ is continually blowing; the rain is continuall falling; the divine tree is continually

Dr. Lotfullah rold me this morning that the English were going to build a prison on the site of the Earracks in Acca where Baha'dsllah and His followers were imprisoned for two years. (this is to be a prison for all Palestine)

When th y were told of the imprisonment and after investigation, told the Baha'is that these rooms would not be trusted but left as a sacred spot for the believers all over the world to visit in future years.

Oct. 24, 1920.

This afternoon we visited the Holy Tomb of the Bab.

W left the Pilgrim House at 3:30 in 'Abdu'l-Baha's little Ford car.

We were received by several women believers in the little house just beside the Tomb and there were served tea. Oct.24, 1920...Luncheon....Pilgrim House

A.B.4.. Look at the beautiful view and the beautiful weather. If you are ill here we will have to fine you.

How is Emogene? It is good that thou didst not go until the friends came. Emogene....I am very happy. Mrs C... We are also happy to find her here.

A.B. When I look at the flag in the distance it reminds me of the King(Louis) of France. He killed many of the Uhristians .Whenever they could be found he would kill them. Then at last a thought came to him. "We have killed th Christians, what result did we get out of it day by day this lamp grows brighter. It is sure that the end end will be greater still. Although I caught them, punished them, banished them and killed them, this flag has been raised higher. Ther There is no daubt that this flag(Christian) will be raised more in the future and our flag flag will descend. Therefore it is better that we remedy the past before our flag is defeated and we come under that flag.

- He gathered all the princes and ministers addressing them saying: "What have we de done to the Christians?" They said that with with the utmost power we began to kill and annihilate them. Then Louis said:

"What was the use of it! Could we annihilate them, could we extinguish this light, could we keep this flag from being raised? There is no doubt that this flag will be laised and it will bering our flag down. Now as long as our flag has not come down, let us go under their flag."

They became excited and brought objections.

bearing fruit/ Appreciate their value. These are the days of spring, the days of Baha'u'llah. The days of autumn and winter will come. Now these days are the days of Baha'u'llah. Trees grow in the springtime, in the springtime they blossom; in the springtime they bear fruit. In autumn they do not be bear fruit. nay rather, their leaves become yellow and drop and they become like dry wood.

Look here, Fugita, see here are Mrs Goodall ar and Mrs Cooper. God has brought them here to thee (to the ladies) Fugita was longing to see you here. See the power of God: this is a Japanese youth. See how He has brought him here and made him to enter the Kingdom of God. These people who have lived in Acca for fifty years have not realized the importance of the Cause of God. They are totally deprived. This is the condition which Christ foretold: "Man shall come from the East and from the West etc..but the sons of the Kingdom shall go out etc..(find correct quote)

Mrs F....Mrs C..was ill thn bed for several days in Naples.

Mrs C...And celled in a doctor for 'Abdul'-Baha taught me when I was in Haifa before that if I were ill to consult a doctor.

A.B... The Blessed Beauty says that when one becomes ill he should refer his case to a doctor, for he knows how to diagnose the illness however much a man nay have done carpentering, the carpenter is better. A learned man may try to become a chauferr..one who has studied in college, naturally such a one is better. A good number of people in the Orient become af fected with diseases, and the reason is that they do not refer these cases to a doctor.

October 25... Filgrim House Luncheon ..

A.B. .. The gathering of the friends is like

a magnet. In the same way that a magnet draws iron to itself, the love of God gathers them together. This is like two mirrors opposite each other. The light from one is reflected in the other, and from the other back to the first, for it is the one sun which shines in them both. The light which I reci eive from His Holiness Baha, I give unto you. Every grace which I receive from Him, I give back to you.

Someone praised Fugita who was serving the friends

A.B...From the day he came he has progressed very much.

Mrs R...A little girl on the steamer asked me what put the salt in the sea, and no one could answer her.

A.B. There are salt mines in the sea as ther are mines in the earth. The waves come and the salt becomes melted and is mixed with the water. In small lakes where there are no mines the water is fresh; but where there are mines the water is salty. But in the dead sea(Lake Loot) there is salt. The surrounding land is salty also. The same is true of Salt Lake in America. In the Mediterranean sea there is salt, but not much. BNt there are other seas which have a great many mines. There are many sait mines in the earth.

There is another way: when the rain storm come in the mountains the salt is washed down to the sea. The water evaporates and the salt remains. Whatever the storms bring from the mountains, flows into the sea. And as the lakes (Salt Lake and Dead Sea) have no outlets, the salt collects there. Now they have become so salt that no animal can live ' in them

Mrs C...It is a good experience for the

believers of the West to see the love of the believers of the East. A.B...Go to Fersia.then you will see what love is: it is extraordinary there. The believers in Persia have had great tests.

For example, their properties were conf scated, they were imprisoned, their families were exiled, and in the end they themselves were martyred. They were subjected to such tests, yet in the arena of martyrdom they were crying aloud, 'Ya Baha-el-Abha!'

People will not leave you alone. They will insult you for my sake. Wou will be blamed. How many trials you will bear! Even your relatives and near ones will desert you, will shun you. All these are for love of me. In the same way that I have for the sake of Baha'u'llah accepted every calemity and ordeal, in the same way you ought to accept all for my sake. That which I have r received is everlasting life; it is from Baha'u'llah and I give it unto you.

The teachings I have received from Baha I give unto you. The food which His Holiness Baha'u'llah has given to me I have made you my pertner in it. The value of this partnership is not known now, but in the Kingdom of God you will see that this partnership is of the Holy Spirit.that this partnership is eternal life.

Mrs F...We hope we shall not fail. A.B....God willing you will remain firm. The same way that I remain firm in Baha'u' llah,you will remain firm and steadfast in me Mrs C...What form will persecutions in America take,will it come through Bolschevism? A.B...It will be a light persecution. It will not be like that in Persia. In Fersia they killed, they beheaded.

A.B....When love enters the heart the bitter water becomes sweet, disegreeable water becomes agreeable.

When I was in Baghdad a Thornseller invited us to see him. His dwelling was 20 miles from Baghdad. He had a hut made of reeds, and he invited us there. At that time we had no horse, no donkey, no carriage; for all our possessions had been pillaged - even a donkey had not been left to us, so we went a foot. The weather was very hot and I had no umbrella.

We arrived there in the afternoon. This man had a wife who was a believer.

She took water and wheat and moulded them together without yeast. She dug a hole in the ground and made a fire in it. When the place was hot she took out the fire and put in the d dough which she mad made into balls and covere them with the fire. Later she took them out. They looked very black. She brought some dates. The balls were only warm dough. We all ate them, and a few dates, with our fingers

But I have never eaten such delicious food for it was cooked with love. At night she prepared another dish in the same way/ It was warm dough and dates, but we ate with relish. Its taste is still in my mind. How completely that man and wife were filled with love! Notes of Haifa.

Oct.24, 1920... Supper at 'Abdu'l-Baha's house.

8 p.m. 19 at table.

Mrs Cooper... We miss Hadji Mirza Hyder Ali very much. We have just heard that he has passed away.

A.B....Yes, he ascended. Hadji Mirza Hyder Ali was one of the souls who was immersed in the Kingdow of God; he was unaware of the material world; he lost himself in Baha'umlah; he had no thought by day nor by night save that of the Kingdom of God. At the age of thirty he became a believer and remained firm until his death. For over sixty years he had no thought save that of service in the Kingdom. Altho apparently he was walking on earth, in reality he was among those of the Supreme Concourse.

His station is not yet known; in the futur future it will be appreciated.

The same is true of his honor, Mirza Abul Fazl. These two blessed souls were two stars in the firmament of bhevenuse.

There is a Persian proverb: "The outer is the expression of the inner" For instance, th this lamp is the outer, the light which it contains is the inner. The outer in this cas expresses whiat is within.

Now we have gathered in this spot thru the grace of His Holiness Baha'u'llah. Altho it is in the metarial world it is an indication of our meeting in the Kingdom. In the same way that we are gathered at this table, we hope that we shall be gathered at the table in the Kingdom of Abha: this table is the counterpart of that table.

This is the Lord's Supper. Sometimes material things have spiritual effect. For instance, music is something material, but it has an effect upon the spirit; Sweet per-

* - -

perfume is material, yet it has a spiritual effect. Cleanliness is something material, but it has a spiritual effect. It is our hope that altho this food is material its effect will be spiritual.

We had a friend in Baghdad, by name Hadji Hassan. of Tabriz. He was very nertous and restless. One day he came to the holy presence of the Blessed Beauty. There was a quince on the table. The Blessed Beauty gav it to him and said: "This quince is quieting. Eat it!" Hadii Hassan took the guines and went out dancing. While eating the quince he continued dancing and repeating, "It is quieting, it is quieting". He did become quiet; his restleasness entirely changed to tranquility. Now the quince was material, but it had a spiritual effect. Verily, he ate the quince saying: "Thissis quieting, eat it, this is quieting."

(Referring to our visit to the Tomb of the Bab)

Mrs C..We have been in heaven today. A.B...God willing, you will always be in heaven/ In the Bible it is said that no one goes to heaven save he who has come from heaven. Then it states that the Son of man said: "I am in heaven" while He was on the earth: this is in the Bible/

Now consider these gnorant ones who thought that what Christ maintwas not true, whi whilst in reality the heaven was always with Vhrist.

His Holiness Christ gathered His disciples one evening et supper and bestowed upon them his teachings because it was near the time of His crucifizion. He gace them as much as was necessary. October 26, 1920...Pilgrim House...Luncheon

Mrs F...Miss Stewart has told us about #

book they used in Persia, for children quoting the sayings of the different prophets. May we have a translation of it for the teaching of the children in America? A.B...Very good! Excellent! (to Miss S.)

How many years have you been in Persia? Mi s S...Nine years. A.B...This number is very good.

Miss S... In Teheran there were meetings

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everywhere, up to the time of the rec nt difficulties, when the names of certain B's. were posted in the bazaars. They intended to begin their persecutions by killing these prominent Bahai's. The Frime Minister gave his consent to these actions because he wante to please the people.

A.B...All the people are negligent, they are

not thinking of p easin God and spreading the word of God. Notwithstanding it has been tried(and found out) that whoever tried to please the people displeased God, and he who tried to please God, became assisted and cojfirmed. God ordained this order that men might become liberated. Notwithstanding thia the Blessed Peauty was very kind to the father of the Prime Minister. His grandfather usused to visit the house of the Blessed Beauty every night.

The heavenly food is good. This food (speaking of the food at the table) gives trouble (indigestion). That heavenly food gives strength and salvation. The effect of this food is only for a day; but the strength of that is everlasting. It is strange that the people are so ignorant about it and are unaware of the heavenly food. How devoted they are to darkness. Even now they are running away from light. Like a thief who always runs away from the light, and who wished for darkness upon darkness. Why? Because light reveals his wickedness. The owner of the housewants it always to be lighted, but the thief wants darkness.

FAST

Mrs F...Some of the friends in /America say that the fast is not tobe observed now, but in the furure.

A.B.:. In places where it will be a cause of trouble, such as in Bokhara or Afganistan, or in some of the towns in Persiathe fast cannot be kept. In these places, if the fast were kept, it would be the cause of trout trouble, people would rise against them. Dut in those places where there issdeety anf a security it should be kept. I fasted sixty years. I was the first one to keep the FAST.

Mrs F...In a family where it is difficult should one atternt to keep the fast? A.B...Difficulty is not a prevention; but if fastinh gives rise to inharmony it is injurious.

Frs C... If it is not possible to take

breakfast before sunrise, should one keep the fast the best one can? A.B...If there be a preventice it should not

be kept. As far as one rossibly can, yes: but if there be any preventabive st any time, NO. But after sunrise one cannot eat.

I useto fast from sunset to sunset. Early morning eat ng was difficult for me therefore when I ate in the evening I took nothing else until the following evening. Mrs H... If one's health does not seem to permit of fasting should one keep it?

A.B... In that case the doctor must decide. The object is not this, that not eating is not forbidden, but eating is forbidden. This is the object: not eating is not forbidden, but eating is forbidden.

Mrs C...When it is difficult ir impossible to begin at sunrise, is it permissable to keep the fast as much as one can? A.B...No! After the sunrise nothing should

be taken unless the doctor says that fasting would be injurious. In that case one can est at any time one wishes. But the whole time (of fasting) is only twelve hours...This is nothing.

Mrs F... Some of the friends that the life is strenuous in America that it is not possible to work and keep the fast. A.B...In the Toreh the command for fasting

is from sunset to sunset for three days. For three days and three nights the jews take nothing. This is not obligatory. There are fasts of three days, seven days and nine days. Mr X. in Persia did n t believe that one could fast for nine days. He brought a Jew and imprisoned him in a room and locked the door, and did not permit anything(food or water) to be taken to him. Indeed, his prisoner took nothing for nine days, not even water. For six days he slept, then he could not slepp any more; but he was very weak.

But now, in this revelation, it is only twelve hours.... very little

This material food is not good. It is no not worthy of you. But it is my hope that the sniritual food may compensate, so that you may be filled with the spiritual food; you may receive spiritual strength, your hearts may be strengthened; your life may be strengthened; your heavenly susceptibil les may be increased; you may receive more heavenly grace; and that you may obtain the utmost harpings, an exhibitation.

Mrs F... Should those men who are employed in mines,steel mills,etc. where it seems nevessary to eat often to keep up their energy, be emempted? A.B... This depends upon the advice of an

expert doctor. If the doctor says that fasting would be injurious, to the health of such people they should not fast

Mrs F... What is the age limit for fasting? A.B....Seventy years....(To Mrs C.) Your mother should not fast. October 27, 1920 ... Pilgrims House. . Luncheon.

Mrs C ... We have always understood that

'Abdu'l-Baha did not eat meat, but we see that he does. Is he not eating it to please us.

A.B...Yes, I eat it in order that I may be your partner. In the same way, in the world of the Kingdom, I may be your partner, God willing, that on earth and in heaven we m may be co-partners. You are always and every where with me.

Mrs R... "ill the unworthy ones be with the worthy ones in the kingdom? A.B...Yes, thru the grace of God. If God acts with mercy it will be so. When a teacher is kind, he accepts the children who have not capacity as well; for He knows that

these will find capacity while in the school. This is the way that a kind teacher acts. A kind father also accepts those children who have capacity and those of his who have not.

MRs.R...I meant myself only, not others. A.B.... God willing, thou wilt become worthy I am educating thee so that thou mayest b become worthy.

Mrs R ... That makes me very happy.

Mrs F. Is this the time to write plays based upon the persecutions of the Baha'is and the history of the Cause for presentation to the people thru the moving picture?

A.B... It is very good. It will have much effect. It will have great effect. Have you seen the picture of Mirza Badi who took the epistle of the Blessed Beauty(to the Shah Have you seen it?

Haifa.

All... Yes. Ne have seen it. A.B... It is in the room of the Greatest Boly Leaf. Ask and they will show it to you All We have seen it in America. A.B... This is one is colored. They colored this in Teheran. Mrs F... In speaking of the persecutions, I mean: to display the pictures in public places? A.B., Yes. Then one likes a thing, even tho it is given under ground he likes it. Mrs C... Is the prayer, "Is there any remover of difficulties" etc.. to be used 95 times every morning for 19 days? A.B.... Every day in the morning 95 times, either for 9 days or 19 days. Mrs C ... Is not the Obligatory prayer or daily prayer to be used in the West as well as the East? A.B... There are THREE prayers. One is necessary. Mrs F. Some people think that these prayers are for the East only, especially those with the prostrations ... washing the hands etc A.B.... There are THREE DAILY PRAYERS. One of them has no prostrations, one only sits and repeats it. This is the easiest of all, but the second one has the prostrations. The THIRD one , the longest, has many pros-

million (dollars) If it is according to the original plan it would take about fifty years to build it.

MRs R... They hope to start the building early in the spring.

Mrs C...I wish to speak bout Mr McNutt. He has sent a copy of his introduction to 'Abdu'l-Baha's Addresses in America, which are soon to be published.

A.B....All right.

Mrs C...Mr McNutt sold his home. After which a Tablet came telling him to keep it, so Mr McNutt took it back, then submitted the matter to the Eaha'i Board to see what could be-done. They decided to improve it and make it income bearing property. Does A.B. approve of this plan? the property, make big improvements and use it as a Baha'i home. Must be income bearing so the friends can be able to but it from Mr McNutt. Is this approved?

A.B. Very good. If they, the believers, buy it is very good. This house will remain as a remembrance.

Mrs C...They will rebuild and have rooms for viditing and permanent guests; thus it will become income bearing property. A.B...Very good. 'Abdu'l-Baha h s spoken in that house; His Holiness Baha'u'llah has been mentioned there; 'Abdu'l-Baha has given the proofs and arguments of the teachings of Hhs Holiness Baha'u'llah there; the confirmations of the Holy Spirit desc...cended upon that house.

Mrs C...Miss Jean Masson who is writing

by 'Abdu'l-Baha's command an answer to the Wilson Book, sends her love to the Master, and begs his assistance in this difficult tesk.

A.B., God willing, she will be assisted. Mir Mirza Abul Fazl has also written such an a answer, have you seen it? "e has written it very well. There was a missionary from Tabriz who happened to meet Lady Blomfield in London .-- This is rather amusing --- He celled at her house and spokete her very freely against the Cause, trying to fill her mind with doubts about the Movement, Lad Blomfield listened patiently to all he had to say. He 'hought he has impressed her. Finally he asked her what she thought of all he had told her. She answered with great dignity: "What you have said is exactly the same as the Pharisees said concerning Christ; you ar one of the Pharisees yourself." He became angry and got up and went awey.

Oct.28 1920..Pilgrim House....Luncheon

A.B. The Jews were expecting the appearance of His Holiness Christ, but they were expecting him to come with certa n signs.

First: They were expecting him to come from an unknown place. They knew that His Holiness came from Nazereth. This is writtenr in the Bible. They understood that His Holiness would have to come from an unknown place. This they learned from the Books of the Oct 29,1920....Vivisection....

For instance, the animals that are diseased suffer more than from death..To die is better than to suffer from these diseases. If it dies thru vivisection it is for a higher purpose.

Mr.R...They freed them for this purpose they do not the diseased animal. ArB.

That part on which they wish to operate should be sound. it is not necessary for the whole animal to be sound. For instance they wish to experiment, on the eye, the eye should be sound.

Mrs H...question about serum

A.B...Df some one suffers from gout, he prefers to die, but his mind is all right, For instance, if the brain is diseased and he becomes insane, but his hands and feet are all right.

For instance, his head is diseased, but his body is all right. For instance, if he has cancer, every day he suffers worse than death, but his brain is working all right. For instance, if they operate on such an animal it will put an end to its suffering. There is great advantage in vivisection, because operation on this animal .humanity is saved from thousands of diseases. The animal should be choloroformed.

Mrs R. They do not always use chloroform. A.B. They should. There are many diseases

that can be discovered thru postmortem examination. Physicians in olden times did not use vivisection.

B.B... Often said that if man should be con-

tented with vegetable diet, it would be better. Vegetable diet is cleaner than enimal diet. Mrs C. Great movement in England and

America against vivisection if they say there is not erough scientific result to compensate for the suffering of the animals.

A.B...Diseased animals that cannot recove

had better be used for vivisection, and not those which are sound. They say that vivisection should be done in a sound organ or a sound limb.

There are many cases in which one half the body is parelyzed while the brain is also working well. There was once a Baha'i whose v ' whole body to his neck was paralyzed ... two parts only were sound; his brain and his. alimentary canal. For seceral years he was Gov.general and he was very efficient. He could not raise his hands. Someone else had to feed him ... if he was stung by an insect he did not feel it. If he was bitten by an animal he could not feel it nor could he drive it away. But his brain was working thoroughly. He was governing far betteran than those who were sound. Every work which we do, we can do it in justice or tyrany,

Now vivisection justie and kindness abould practiced, not tyrany. If chloroform is not used it is tyranny.

Mrs.F..Some extremists believe that minimainam criminals instead of animals shou d

be used.

A.B...No! Not at all. Even those who are condemned to death should be killed in such human way that should not feel it at all ... with electricity ... electric chair.

A.B....This has significance; it needs explanation. The point is this, that this

is the fire of the love of God. i i te s njetemi s^{en} Stanege nje u njetem n

Mrs F ... Was the town of Haifa here at that time?

A.B...Yes, at the place where the convent is now situated. It was called Haifu. which means in the Phoenician language, 'the foot of the mountain'.

Mrs F ... How long did Elijah remain here to teach?

A.B., From twenty to thirty years, until he had accomplished his work of educating the neople.

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Rouha Khanum told us yesterday that when Acca was taken by the British.two Indian soldiers entered Acca and asked the people if they wished this city to be taken by the sword, or peacefully.

They were so happy to be under the English protection after so many years under Turkish rule, that they dressed up in their best clothes, and all went out to welcome the British soldiers. All was done inside of one hour.

An English Jew, Sir Samuels was appointed Governor of Palestine. Gov. Samuels had met formerly AAbsu'l-Eaha in London. When he came to Palestine he said he was happy - to renew his acquaintance with A.B. and to. take advantage of his great wisdom in the management of affairs, in Palestine.

November 2, 1920. .. Pilgrim House ... Lunchson ...

A.B.... I wanted to come for breakfast this,

morning but could not. I have been serv g ing the people at lunch at the other house and now I have come here.

His Holiness Christ said, that the one who wishes to be greatest among you must be your servant. (In Anglish) Good servant, good servant;

One must be either a serpent or a servant; he must choose. The people who are arrogant are serpents not servants.

It is very difficult to arrange the . matter concerning Mrs B's land. The work which Assad'u'lleh and Fareed did was not solid. At that time they should have secured a title from the government. They failed to do this. Now it would be better to sell it. It is worth twice as much as she paid for it. If she maid IOO 1bs, sell it for 200 lbs. Find out how much she baid, then after the price is found out it can be bought by some one. This is better. It is in the name of Enayatullah, and not Mrs E., so it can be sold. If it vere in her name it could not be sold. I have thatt much over "his and have come to that conclusion. I will pay Mrs B. the price if she is willing to sell. Send a cable and find out and I will send the money -- thus the matter may be solved. It has been un settled for ten years. This is better.

Mrs.C..Mrs B. wished to give it to 'Abdu'l-Baha if it still belongs to her.

A.B... I cannot accept it, as Mrs B. is needy, but do not tell her this.

I once bought a piece of land. There was a man who was very antagonistic and tried to prevent my securing a title; but with great difficulty everything was settled. This man Prophets not from their own imaginations. This is correct. The meaning of the unknown place, i.e. of the other world, was the world of God, but did not understand this, but thought it meant from an unknown city. SECONDLY: The scepter must be of iron, i.e.

he would appear with a sword, while His Holiness Christ did not possess even a wooden stick. This also is correct.

The meaning of an aron scepter or the sword or the sword is the tongue of His Holiness which divided the truth from untruth,or truth from falsehood. But the Jew thought that the sword was to be of iron. <u>THIRD</u>: That he should sit on the throne of

David. It is clear that he did not have a throne: he did not have even a mat to sit on. The throne of His Holiness is a heavenly throne, not a throne which is built of gold and silver.

FOURTH: That he shouls concuer the East and the West. But in reality his Holiners did not conquer the Wast and the West with a sw sword. He conquered it with the power of the Holy Spirit.

FIFTH: That he should reign for a thousend years. For three years he lived under the greatest difficulties.

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October 29, 1920. Pilgrim House ... Luncheon ..

A.B....I long to be always with you. Altho I am striving day and night with my work

it is never finished.

Mrs C...We are very thankful that 'Ada'l-Beh: gives us so much of His time. A.B...It happens that you have come at a time when I do not have the opportunity to be with you very much. I have been hoping to accompany you to the Holy Tomb (Bahji) but I find that I cannot.

Mrs F...Will 'Abdu'l-Baha speak of the cavr of Elijah and the Israelites who were here at the time of Elijah, that we may take His ords to the Jews in America? A.B....Some souls appeared among the Jews.

the people of Moses, who concealed their real motives, but apparently they arose to work a a religious people. After His Holiness Solomon some one appeared called Jeroboam, who conspared with the majority of the the Israelites against Rehaboam, and succeeded. He, JEROBCAM, like unto the violaters of today, concealed His real purpose.

The first thing that he did was to tell the Israelites that in the time of Solomon th taxes were very burdensome, but now that Rehoboam was on the throne, they should ask him to lighten the burden, so that his reign might be prosperous. This concession would please all the people. He set this trap in the guise of kindness, telli is them that as the king was kind he would surely grant their request. All the people became happy. He led them to the king and began to ask him to lighten the taxes.

Rehaboam consulted with the old men, and they sgreed that there was no harm in making this concession. Then he consulted with the youngmen, but they objected say ing:

'Since you have just succeeded to the throne you had better refuse this request, so that the people may not get into the habit of demanding such concessions, otherwise every day they will find a pretext for making more demands.

In brief, Jeroboam created this dissention

Oct.20.

Rehaboam told the people that his father had been just; that the taxes were moderate and it was not possible to lighten them any more. Nay, rather, he should add to them.

JEROBOAM talked with the people and increased the dissension. he was thinking of le leadership for himself; but he was concealing his real purpose. In the guise of kindness he expressed his sympathy for the people, and told them that Rehaboam was not a kind king and was not considerate of them. In short he went on with his intrigues to such an extent that he produced great rebellion among the Israelites. Day by day that rebellion increased until the Jews gave up the religion o of God. Finally it resulted in the r giving up entirely the worship of God and they began to worship Baal.

The founder of this idol-worship was Jeroboam. The rebellion grew until was broke out between Jeroboam and Rahaboam in which many people were killed. All their wise men failed to cure the evil; darkness upon darkness overtook them. The Israelites became degenerate; corruction reached such a point that they became worshippers of Baal.

In Tyrse there was an idol made of copper called BAAL; it was hollow and under it they wouldbuild a fire. The arms were extended. The priest would come and place a child on th arms, and the child would be burned until it was unnenmedous ashes. Thus the Israelites worshipped BAAL.

The violaters of the Jews pretended to be religious and ended in idol worship. At such a time his honor Elijah appeared. He dwelt in this cave, and his food consisted of fish which he caught hirself.

Elijah gathered some of the young men and taught them ble religion of God in the CAVE. They became holy souls. Having educated them he sent thor out to teach among the people. In this way he trained the Israelites and re-established the religion of God.

The Israelites were divided into two parties: one became worshippers of God; the other remained idol worshipers. These two parties fought together until they decided upon.... so that it might be known which party was right.

3

They decided that both of them should offer a sacrifice, that fire might come down from heaven to burn the sacrifice of the of them. Whichever sacrifice was burned, that party was the true one.

The priests of Baal came and brought a few ears of corn for sacrifice, and prayed from morning until evening; but no fire descended from heaven. Then his honor Elijah killed a lamb and offered it as a sacrifice, and suddenly a fire appeared and burned the lamb.

So it was proved that Elijah was the t... true one. Then Elijah ordered the priests of Baal to be killed. They - 360 of them were killed. He re-established the religion of Moses. Complete reformation was established. Idol worship was abolished. Again the Jews became worshippers of God.

The social and political affairs also were improved.

Having finished his mission, Elijah sought retirement and disappeared from among the people.

Now the Jews believe that a chariot of fire descended from heaven and caught him up to heaven; but the fact is that he retired to spend his time in communion with God. This is the story.

Mrs F...Is it true that real fire burned the lemb. This seems like superstition. even tried to bribe the government. When it was all settled and my title was clear I sent

word to Baha'u'llah and He sent back word: "Leave the earth to the people of the earth" and I immediately destroyed the title and gave the land to the man.

Mrs C...Does the Master approve of the believers buting land here? A.B.... Yes. very good!

Mrs F... "ill the land on Mt Carmel belong to believers eventually/

A.B...Yes, all the land of Haifa and Acca will belong to believers.

Mrs R., mentioned about Mrs Nourse's land on Mt.Carmel, and asked if she should

communicate with Fareed about getting it back A.B... I do not say to anyone to complain abo about another. She is authorised to do what she likes. 'Abdu'l-Baba does not aommand anyone to have a law suit. Cable to Mrs B...

Copy of Cable...."Clear title to Brittingham lot. Master says sell twice original price. Later buy another. Cable consent. (Signed) E.Cooper.

Nov.4, 1920. Pilgrim House. . Luncheon ...

A.B... Yesterday was very pleasant with Arthur. No other chauffeur could have managed. Today the auto should be cleaned, the salt water ruins it.

(To Arthur) You sjowed that you were an expert yesterday, but you should make Fugita : and Khrosro like yourself. Mrs C.. Does A.B. sapprove of our going to Jerusalem?

A.B... Yes, It is necessary. You will go n

now and visit the Holy Places and in the spring, God willing, I will go. These spots are sacred in our eyes. The tourists who come to visit the sacred spots, are not real pilgrims, for while they are visiting the tombs they are not thinking of Christ; their thoughts are distracted; they are not mindful of the place the, are visiting. You will be real pilgrims. You will be conscious of how Christ suffered, how much he endured, and how they denied Him; how He was falsely accused until at last tiey crucified Him. You must think of His Holiness Christ se that you may be real pilgrims.

Mrs cC. When we came before we did not car care to go to Jerusalem, because we had come to the new Jerusalem. A.B...Jerusalem is Jerusalem, but the real "erusalem is spiritual: the teachings of God. You will visit the material Jerusalen both are esteemed in the sight of God. Most pilgrims who go to Jerusalem simply visit the stones walls and doors. No thought of Christ. Should the Jews find Christ there, they would kill Him again in the same way that Jesus was killed. They sing and pray and supplicate for the coming of the Messieh, and when He came they martyred Him. They would do it again. They are still weeping.

There is an old wall remaining of Solomon's Temple. They gather there, kiss the wall and weep; but when Christ came, they crucified Him. You will see the wall. Men, woman and children weeping and praying. But praise be to God! you are believers in all the Prophets of God. You believe in Moses, Christ, Muhammad, the Bab and the Blessed Beauty. You have faith in all.

The Jews believe in Moses only and seny Christ-are enemies of Christ.

A.B....This is America food.

Mrs F...said that in America potatoes were high and that people are learning to

eat rice, because of profiteering. A.B...This profiteering is a great tyrany

in America. I am astonished that people believe they have justice while such thin's as this go on. The monopoly of food and profiteering

^o Mrs C...There is a Japanese in California who has cornered the potato market. He is called the 'Potato King'.

A.B...I found in New Yor! that the poor

people were longing for fruit: to have grapes, apples, pears etc. They told me they could not have them on account of high prices

The fruit was brought from Calif. to New York and kept in the hands of a few, and sold at high prices; and rather than give it to the poor or sell it for lower price, it was thrown into the sea. They poor would see this and long for it. What greater cruelty than this! Everything is monopoly in America except the water and air.

Mrs F.. In America we are sending women to the legislature in order that we may have more justice.

A.B... I hope the women will succeed. If they try to remove the monopoly they will

succeed at present then women have been successful in securin prohibition. Mrs F...spoke of the invention of the talking doal in which some of the f friends are interested.

A.B....It is good to teach children. It is good.

Mrs C...Where is the grape-vine that

'Abdu'l-Baha planted, and how many times a year does it bear?

A.B... The grape vine was in Acca and bore sever times a year. When there were blossoms on it there were also fruit. I planted the garden when surrounded by spies, at the time the inspectors came from Constantinope. Then I planted that garden. In Acca at that time there were rumors that I would be sent to Faezan(Africa), or thrown into the sea. All the people were expecting that I would be taken away, while I was busy planting ny garden. They would pass and see me and laugh, and say that they are trying to take him to Faezan, and he is planting apples and orange trees and vines, .. and . they would laugh. I did not mind; I had no work to do; I was not receiving letters; I could not write any; no pilgrims could come, so I was busy planting my garden. In that garden there were oranges, sour lemons and sweet lemons, mandarines, apples, apricots. - pears, different kinds of dates, different kinds of grapes, and this onebkind of grape vine that bore fruit seven times a year. All the trees became fruitful while I was there.

In those days I bright about the marriage of some of the friends. Enayatullah was married then. All these circumstances passed those (?) who scolded and laughed, came afterwards and asked Ismaelah(gardener) to give them some of those trees I had planted. Nov. 4, 1920 Home of Abdu 1-Baha nuse

Thtroduction to anout the

The Master had received a letter in which one of the friends says that he, together with some other friend had an interview withe the Prime "inister, Mustafa-el-Mamalik, thru instrumentality of thmm an Ezeli who, during the war four years ago came to Haifa, visited the Master and was attracted to His beauty.

These two friends told the Prime Minister that it would immunumi not be good for Persia's prosperity if the government should allow any move persecuting of the Baha'is who had done nothing against the Gov. nor the people. This converted Ezeli spoketo the Prime Minis. of his experiences in Haifa during his visit to the Master.

The Prime¢ Minis. said : ""t is true I hav not seen His Holiness 'Abdu'l-Baha yet I te stify that he is the wisest man in the world.

A.B....Not one among the former religious

sects as the ews, spoke a word of praise concerning His Holiness Christ or concerning His Holiness Muhammed. They said to Noah: "We dont see thy followers except a few vagabonds."

Now the Cause is shining so gloriously that a person such as the Prime Minister says: "That a servent of the servents of the Blessed(Perfection)Beauty is the first mind of the world". How great is the CHorse! Notwithstanding this the Persians are negligent. M.M. says this and the ungrateful relatives, how unjust are they! Almost all the people were despising hos moliness Christ. The Muhammedans do not know what the people were doing to His Holiness the Prophet. Koran: "The hands of Abu Lahel shall perish (Father of Flame), and he shall perish. His riches shall not profit him, neither that which he hath gained. He shall go down to be burned into the flaming fire and his wife also bearing wood, having on her neck a cord of twisted fibre of a palm tree."

A.B....When this Sura was revealed the wi wife of Abul-Lahal got angry, bec me indignant and started to go and see Muhammed to quarrel with him. On her way she met the wife of Abul Jahl(father of ignorance). The atter asked her where she was going, and she said:"D am going to a man who thinks he is a prophet. The asked:"What is your business with him".

She replied: "I am the most revered soul in my tribe and the acknowledged Queen of the tribes, how does he dare to call me 'bearer of wood"', and sayest that I have a chrd of twisted palm leaves around my neck. See this necklace which I have around my neck is of pearls.'

The wife of Abi Jahl said: "What is the matter with you? You should not deign to speak to him. He is insane. he says that the tree of Zayhim springs up from the middle of hell" Now Muhammed was considering the reality of the woman which was in fact the bearer of wood for the fire of hell and what Muhammed was considering was correct.

"ow you see the people were despising th the prophets in those days in this way. It is the explicit text of the Koran and not tradition.(Sura Muhammed) "O thou to whom word of God is revealed thou art but an insect."

The text of Koran andn God testify that the people were considering Muhammed as the lowest person. They would say..'Is it he whom God has sent as a prophet?'

raise be to God, nobody could say a word of scorn against His Holiness the first Point or His Holiness the Blessed Beauty.

The Nost eloquent of t he learned men of Arabis ,whether Suni or Shii have composed such eulogies upon the Blessed B..that astonish one.

A very learned Christian says:"I am not a Baha'i and I do not believe in His prophethood of Baha'u'llah but to be fair the miracles of Baha....are as evident as the sub."

Today almost all the papers of the worl are praising the Cause. The only papers which are scorning the Cause are if our own country...Persia.

One of the editos(Persia) has written a letter to me. I dont mention his name bec because he does not wish it. "e says:"In Persia there is a society which has arisen with all its power to undermine the Holy Cause.

They have sent me some letters and articles for pizublication, but, do not p publish them in my papers". A.B.

This man wants to be ocliging. He has frequently written ,e, but up to now I have been lenient toward him. I wrote him this time .. 'What is this you have been writing me? What are these obligations under which you place me? Write what thou wishest, and do not think if these letters are published that they can do any harm to the Cause. As thou hast experienced whate ver the peop have written has not affected the Cause. The Danner of God is waving on high. 0 my friend! consider a little and hear how the Trumpet call of 'Ya Baha el Abha' is being raised among the nations of Turkey, rersia, Australia, Africa, Europe and America. What art thou talking about. Go and attend to ye your orn affairs. Art thou trying to put me under obligations. Go and write what thou wishest. Then will all contribute to the promotion of the Cause and can do nothing else."

Nov.5, 1920...Pilgrim "ouse...Luncheon

The Master was speaking (in Persian) about conditions in Persia to a noted Persian pilgrim from Teheran.

A.B....I speak in Persian and you do not understand.

Mrs C...We are happy to hear His voice no matter in what language He speaks.

A.B....The tongue of the soul is the tongueless language.tongue. The spirit speaks

in every language., in no particular tongue. When hearts are connected the spirit speaks eloquently provided the hearts are related together.

People drink wine and say it is useful. It is not the wine, but the juice of the grape which is useful.

The mountain (Carmel) was covered with grap vines and disease came and killed most of them.

Mrs R...There is a grapevine in America which is immune to disease.

A.B...Yes, the government has said that if anyone whuld bring those vines here that are immune from disease, he would be exempt from taxation for IO years. They graft that vine on the vine here, because here the grapes are sweeter. The vines here in the garden are protected. The gardener puts the grapes into a liquod solution, they use copper sulphate here mostly, but it is of no use. What is used in my garden is lime. They use water and copper sulphate and the fruit is dropped into i... this is good. In Acca there are worms that bore into the fruit trees. They came in t garden of Rizwan.I ordered copper sulphate put into the hole and this killed the insect. Even when the trees was nearly dead, it revive

Nov.6, 1920...Pilgrim House....6.P.M.

A.B...I have been for a walk. Motion is the sign of life. If there be no wind, no motion, the air becomes impure. There is motion in everything. All the planets are moving. There is no globe which is absolutely stationary. The people thought that the poles were without motion. In reality there are two motions:rotation and revolution. Some of the heavenly bodies have three motions; that is the earth which revolves on its axis and produces day and night; then the movement around the sun produced the seasons.

The entire solar system moves around a center. There is a sun which is the center of all centers.

For instance our sun with all its planets are moving around a central sun like the moon moves round the earth.

The point is this: that all existing things are in motion, that motion the cause of life and lack of motion is the cause of death. From this talk the purpose is that you should take a ride in the auto, when the weather is good and there is no rain. Mrs Goodall must go when the weather is good. Motions are many: material, essential.

Nov.7, 1920

Today we waited for three quarters of an hour for our Lord. He has been lunching with us every day. Fugita ran over to His house and brought word that we were to eat alone.

While we were seated at the table, Mirza Hadi came and said that our Lord was entertaining a visitor, but would eat with us tonight.

Mirza Madi told us that the visitor was a man who was secretary to the Turkish Gov. during the war and while he was in office he had many friends.

During the war he took some of the British papers and was imprisoned for it but that our Lord was the cause of his release.

Since the British rule in Palestine, of course this man has been out of office, and now has no friends except our Lord. It was he who had called and our Lord (just at luncheon time) went without his luncheon to talk to him.

Nov.IO, 1920..Pilgrimage to Jerusalem

When Mrs Cooper asked 'Abdu'l-Baha whether we should go to Jerusalem he said that our Pil grimage was very necessary; that we would be real pilgrims. He said that people went there to see the stones etc (outward things) but that we would stand in the Holy Blaces and rer member the suffering of Christ.

So we made arrangements to go. The mem bers of the party are: Mrs Cooper, Mrs Ralston Mirza Azzizulah Khan, Dr. Lotfullah Hakim and myself (Mrs randland).

We left Haifa at 5:15 this morning. Fug Fugeta gave us a good warm breakfast at four o'clock: then Arthur Redun, our Lord's efficies colored robe with a fine white cashmere shawl over his arm. In a moment he spread his shawl on the ground and began to use the Muhammedan prayers with prostrations, unaware that any of one was watching him. After he finished anot her man seemed to come from nowhere, sat down beside his friend(the new comer is evidently the servant) opened a basket and proceded to r make Turkish coffee on a little alcogol stove, this they drank with their basket of lunch, after which they smoked cigarettes and then proceded on their journey.

Nov 6,1920

The entire solar system moves around \overline{a} center. There is a sun which is the center of all centers.

For inst ance our sun with all its planets are moving around a centeral sun like the moon moves round the earth.

The point is this: that all existing things are in motion, that motion the cause of life and lack of motion is the cause of death.

From this talk the purpose is that you shoul take a ride in the auto, when the weather is good and there is no rain November 8, 1920... Pilgrim House... Luncheon...

Mrs F...When one looks at the people on the street in Haifa, it seems as though one

hundred years would be required for their spiritual development.

A.B....The people here are like animals. They are not awake. They are very negligent.

Mrs R...Some of them do not look much more intelligent than animals.

A.B....Not only some, but all.

Good news has come from Turkestan (to Azzizullah) Bring the letter and translate for them. It will be read in the meeting tonight and tomorrow you will read it.

Mrs G...How long will it take for the Arabs (here) to become spiritual?

A.B...In fifty to one hundred years it will be accomplished.

Mrs F...When these apparently dead souls pass out will they become spiritual in the other world? A.B...Inshellah.

Mrs F...In one of the fablets we re d that no soul is annihilated that as the mineral in this world is dead in comparison to the veg. so these souls are dead only comparatively speaking. At sometime will they receive their portion--become quickened?

A.B... These souls have life, not spiritual life. They are like abortive children.

They do not attain to(spiritual) life in this world. In the world of God.they may attain to divine grace.....

Mrs C.. Is capitel punishment forbidden in the Baha'i teaching? A.B...No! The murderer shall be killed, not beheaded(hanged), but it should be done by the electric chair.

Mrs H...We find in America there are differen kinds of murder.

A.B... In the Court it becomes clear(the kind **Fire** There are three kinds of murders: FIRST, the one who kills with a purpose, using weapons, such as sword, knife, gun etc. The murderer has the intention of killing. This they call, murder with purpose, or wilful murder.

The SECOND kind is one who does not use firearms or sword, but he beats his vistim with a stick, not intending to kill. This is called not wilful murder. Or a person may the throw a glass of water at someone and kill him. Now the glas is not an instrument fc for killing, yet death is caused. This is also walled not wilful murder.

The THIRD kind is accidental: A man may g go hunting and intending to kill a bird and accidentally he may kill a person.

But the wilful murderer, the one who deliberately lurks for his victim with intent to kill, should be punished. For instance, h he may climb a tree, or a wall and watch for his victim, then jump down and kill him; this is murder with intent to kill.

In the Kitab-i-ARHas it is specified that such a one should be killed. If he is sentenced to life imprisonment, this is worse than death, for every day he dies.

Mrs.H... If he is allowed to live there is a chance for repentence.

A.B...Every murderer has remorse and repents.

Mrs H. Is this repentence accepted before God

A.B... No! There are some affairs in which repentance has effect (no effect ?) God has His own rights, and thebeople have their rights. God, might sacrifice His divine right, but He will not sacrifice the rights of his people. If all murderers are exhonerated because they feel remorse, this would continue to encourage murder. Repentance is not for the murderer. If repentance is sufficien , then anyone can say: 'I will kill and God will forgive me." Any murderer could say. 'I will kill such and such a person and repent and God will forgive met. But if a ma for instance, has done another an injury, if he has tortured or troubled him, if he repent it has effect. But the wilful murderer shoul be killed.

Mrs.H...When a woman in America serves on a jury, she must state whether or not she believes in capitol punishment. Should the Baha'i w omen say that they believe in capito. punishment?

A.B. .They must say that they our belief is that the murderer who wilfully kills, must be killed. This is the command of Baha'u'lla) According to the Kitab-i-ARdas they must be killed.

Ins H...In the Surat-i-Hykal it states that capital punishmennt is abolished.

A.B...There were many books written before the Kitab-i-Akdas; but now the Kitab-i-Akdas is authority.

You do not know how the murdered soul suffers. If you could know and reflect, you yould say that the murderer should be killed. It is impossible to protect society unless he is punished. It is not for revenge. This punishment God alone has the right to revenge. This punishment is for an example, so that others may not do likewise. Every one who murders should be killed by the government. This is for punishment, not revenge.

Mrs C...When 'Abdu'l-Baha was in America

someone asked Him what becomes of the soul of a murderer, and 'Abdu'l-Baha answered that if the murderer was killed by the people, that the justice of God would not mete him a second punishment, because the justice of God will not allow the meting of two punishments.

A.B. .. This is correct. Capital punishment for for the murderer is a bounty.

In the Gospel you read "If the right eye offend thee

If the eye be injured, it is better for the entire body that it be destroyed. It is evident that to pluck out the eye is better, because otherwise, the other parts of the body would become affected. When the murderer is killed and the people see that he is punished for his act, they take this as an example and abstain from murder. If there were no capital punishment you would hear of a murder everyday.

Mrs H. That is why the women in America are taking part in government affairs

A.B. ..praise be to God that over fifty years also, the principle of Baha'u'llah was revealed, that women should have equal rights with men. He revealed this principle when no one else thought of it. Which would you prefer to have the murderer punished in this transitory world where the suffering would be for a short time, or in the eternal world where he would suffer eternally?

Mrs H...Does he not suffer in that world next world if he is punished in thi this?

A.B.... He does not suffer in the next

world. The punishment here has the effect of forgiveness of his sins in the next world.

Nov.8, 1920... Pilfrim House, .. Luncheon.

A.B....Have been with visitors all the morning....Here one must always be with

visitors. They would be offended if I left them.

I am caught among different nations and all refer their cases to me. It is incumbent upon us to deal with them in truth and *i* love. Some are bad in character, they are not truthful, they bring false charges and I must satisfy all. How difficult is this task. It is very difficult!

We must be like rain which falls on the s tone, or cultivated ground and on the sea. Because the favor of Baha'u'llah is assisting all..should reach all. It is lik a sun which shines upon all, a sea which casts waves upon all sides of the shore; a cool breeze which blows to all nations. Man must be like that.

This is the eaching of Baha'u'llah. It is difficult: the rain falls on the ground and the cloud expects that ground to become green and produce flowers, but to its astonishment and disappointment, instead of flowers it has produced therms. It is difficult to bear.

Man should be mindful, patient, tolerant, not look at the people. His gaze must be above, he should act according to the teaching: of Baha'u'llah. The people of Syria are neglectful, ignorant: they have no spirituality. All are impure, surely fradulent, they are untruthful. It is different to deal and mix with them. I have not seen this type of man anywhere else. They are melevolent, pure meterialists, they have so spiritual feelings.

You see a man whose interest and view is centered around stone and clay;still another man who looks at stones, he things about the Creator, how $\not\!\!/ p$ expert to create such wonders. Another who lo ks ar trees. He thinks of the effect and energy of the sun the effect of the breeze that blows; the influence and effect of rain; who has educated these trees. Viewpoints are different.

Nov.IG, 1920...Pilgrim House..... TO A.M.

During the absence of five members who went to Jerusalem for a few days, A.B. called in the pouring rain and asked about the health of the nilgrims. He advised Miss Stewart (Stuart) not to take any more medicine, and told Mrs Goodall to keep warm; spec ally to keep the legs warm.

Speaking of the stormy weather He said it was like springtime compared to the winter He experiences in Muda Pesth. The snow was every where and it was bitter cold. The friends there had great difficulty in finding a place for Him to speak, and the only hall available was on the sixth floor and there was no theatr elevator in the building. He had to walk up I20 steps. Achair was carried along for him to rest in, which he used now and then. While speaking to the people He perspired so that his shirt became soaking wei As there was no place to change it He had to wear it back to the hotel. The weather was so cold the shirt froze on his body.

Nov.13,1920....Pilgrim House. Luncheon...

A.B...You got very tired in Jerusalem. There are many places to visit and so one gets tired.

these can be compared one to the other.

Mrs F...We saw the gate in the wall(around derusalem) which is to be opened wien Christ returns:

A.B...No doubt. They do not open the door to Christ if he should come, as they did not open it in former days.

> Mrs F...Referring to the Jews waiting at the Wall of Solomon. If the Jews w were sincere in their prayers for the return of Christ would they not recognize the Manifestation in this day? A.B...There is no doubt. They are we pin.

because their sovereignty is taken away while the Temple of Solomon has been destroyed/ They are longing to try to esablish Jewish sovereignty. They are not weeping for the sake of God, of Christ, bu. for the sovereignty; they want worldly power, to regain their former power and influence.

A Rabbi told me that they expected a Christ that would come and be successful, that he would conquer the world so that they (the Jews) would become wealthy, powerful predominant over all nations. They want to t become governors or generals. They are not expecting aChrist who will make is wretched and miserable. After Chrsit we became miserable. Titus killed almost all the Jews. We were scattered over the world, almost all were killed. Our wives and children were captured. We were expecting a Christ who would make us conquerers, that we might conquer nations, take possession of all property in the world. But after the appearance of this Christ Titus came and captured all our property, killed our men, destroy ed the temple; our children were taken in captivity, The killed our sons and at last we had to run to other parts of the world. This is a separation that will not be followed by regathering We are not in need of such a Christ ... one who will be crucified and suffer. We do not want this kind. We want one who will asc nd to the throne of David, draw the sword and conquer people and nations of the world, and take all countries. All the poor of Israel will be come rulers in other lends. We expe t such a Cirist. When he comes we shall believe in him We do not want a Christ that will be oppresse but one who will oprress, - who will behead thousands, who will bring into captivity all the kings of the earth. When he comes all the kings of the earth will believe. We do not want a Christ with a crown of thorns, but one who has a crown of jewels, AWe want a hri of Solomon...one who has Solomon's majesty.

They are expecting such a Christ They are weeping for such a Christ to come and the believe he will come. Then all Jews will gain honor and power and all money go into their pockets.

Mrs p...Considering their condition of blindness, how will it be possible for them to accept the present Manifestation. A.B. When the Word of God is raised this impossibility will become possible. In spite of the obstingy they will be obliged to come under the banner of the Cause.

They say we accept His Holiness Baha'u'llah but provided he will not make us believe in Christ. He makes its incumbent for us to believe in Christ and this is why it is hard for us.

Verily, she serves the world of humanity, she is ki d to all the Persians, the Muhammedans, Christians, Magians(fire-worshipers - Zoroastrians), Jews and Baha'is. She is kind to all of them. For that reason I am very pleased with her. Praise be to God that she will be confirmed.

MissS ... The woman is not a patient of Dr. Moody's, "he is a Baha'i/ She asked Dr. Moody when she was writing to me, to ask for healing from the Master for her.

A.B...Very good. But my object was to speak of the general service of Dr.Moody, not any special case.

MissS...Did the Bab and Baha'u'llah ever meet A.B....No!

A.B....(Referring to our trip to Jerusalem)

Did you visit the Holy places? Did you visit visit Solomon's Temple? Solomon's temp was the real temple. They have destroyed the top part of it, and so on that they have rebui lt.

Did you see the Jews at the back of that wall(wailing wall)? The Jews cry there. It is the same wall which was built then. They (Jews) wail there.

Mrs F...Should the Assembly of Santa Paula join with Los "ngeles working as one Assembly?

A.B....No, they should have their individual Assemblies.

Mrs H...Many small Assemb; ies cannot afford to send delegates to the Convention.therefore they have, heretofore, been repre sented by some delegate of a larger Assembly. At the last Convention such representatives were disenfranchise this giving each delegate only one vote. Was this a wise decision? A.B...These affairs must be referred to

the Convention. The Convention is

something like the House of Justice. I do not interfere in these matters.

Mrs F...A believer has written some explana-

tions of the teachings, such as the meaning of Adam and Eve, the Tree of Life, the Prophecies etc. She asks whether she is permitted to spread these teachings.

A.B....She may write it and soy it is her own idea; she may say 'this is what I understand it to be'.

Mrs.C...rs Addison has finished the Index of the Books of Tablets which she asked me to submit to 'Abdu'l-Baha. Should it be submitted to the Convention. A.B...If you can find some one in America

who can translate it into Persian then send it to me. If not, it must be sent to the Convention, and then sanctioned by the Committe of Publication. After that it must be passed by the Convention. If passed by the Convenand accepted, then there can be no objection. If you can have it translted, then send it here Then afterwards, it must be passed and sanctioned by the Committee.

The purpose is that no friction may occur among the friends. In America it is very easy to have friction, but in Persia it is not so. In America every person has a special idea and taste. There is nothing worse than differences. It is most injurious. There is nothing worse.

The Blessed ^Beauty says that if two persons have differences both are wrong. We cannot say that one is right and the other wrong. Both are wrong. In every matter if two believers have differences, both are wrong This teaching is for the purpose of avoiding differences. All matters concerning the "emple should be referred to the "onvention These things as not spiritual, they have nothing to do with the fundamental principles of the Cause. I am only concerned with fundamental things.

Nov 15,1920...At 'Abdu'l-Baha's House...Supper Many pilgrims (about 28) at the table.

A.B....Man, nights we were together at Mr Dreyfus' house. They were happy evenings.

Mr D...The friends are expecting, inshallah, the Master will visit Paris.

A.B...Yes, this wond, inshallah, is very good. I wish especially to go to Geneva and Lausanne.

M. Dreyfus...Geneva will become a center, i the Master goes there.

A.B...Yes, I should like to go if circumstances permit.

M. Dreyfus. Near Geneva we have a home, its name (is 'Dar-es-Salaam''(home of peace)

A.B...God willing, its name, in reality, will become dar-es-salaam.

The days that we were in Paris we spent with the friends; we did not go sightseeing or to see places of interest. ies, one day we went to -----.There were Persians things in there. And one day we went with M.Dreyfus on top the m untain.

M.D...We took Shoghi Effendi there too;he liked it very much.

A.B... es, it is very high and has a very good view. Praise Godthe people of Paris have become a little heavenly.

N.D...Like the other parts of the world, after these five or six years they have changed little. A.B...I passed bye Lausanne. It is a very good city. It has a beautiful view.

I met Zeleh Sultan(Gov.of southern Persia) le was the cause if the martyrdom of the 'King of Martrs, and 'Beloved of Martyrs) by the sea shore. I saw on the shore a man with a european hat on. He was crosseyes. He came near and said: 'Are you Abbes Effendi?' I said:'Yes'.

He said: "I have come to meet you.' The following morning he came to our house. M.Drefus..His son has become minister of

finance. A.B...Yes.

M.D...God willing merica will become spirf itual first. In Paris there are many who are ready for the teachings, but I do not

know how they can become enkindled.

A.B... This movement must be explained to

them clearly. In Paris some one came to me and said: 'One of the well known people of Paris wishes to invite you.' I was speaking to hir of Christ when he said: 'I beg you to talk of another subject; these talks will be the cause of my having little faith in you.'

Then I said: asked what subject I should talk about. "e said: 'Talk of history or science.'

It is for this reason that the people are not ready. Tonight's meeting is similar to those meetings in Paris.

Mrs and Mrs reyfus arrived last night from Port Said. They came from Paris some time ago and have been delayed waiting for a boat to Haifa.

We all dined with our Lord. Many pilgrims from different countries and representing different religions were with us.

The two children(boys) for whom the \$50..was given for their education for one year...Badieh and Abdu'lrasul. The father's name is Ibrahim.

Their grandfather was the wonderful soul who used to bring water to Baha'u'llah in the prison.

One day when he was carrying it under his cloak he was shot in the abdomen. He did not stop, but pressing in the protruding intestine he pushed on until he reached Baha'u'llah, then he fell at his feet dead. The Blessed Beauty counted him as one of the martyrs. Nov.16,1920...Pilgrim House....Luncheon..

A.B... The Baha'is should sacrifice life in the path of each other.

M. Drefus. . said that Nos hugati (one who has

a pilgrim House at Port Said) has served him and his wife very much and another friend, Jalal afshar had served them as well. A.B....I must be so that each one of the

fri nds should prefer others to himself..the others should be first to him.

It has happened in Persia that one of the friends was caught and another sacrificed his life for that one. The Shah wanted to kill some one...one of his friends said: 'I am he', so that the Shah might kill him and the other might go free.

This is the measure of faith, that one should prefer the friend to himself, and should

others first. His Holiness Christ s said: 'Do unto others as you would they should do unto you'.but Baha'u'llah hrs said 'Prefer him to yourself'.

Once they brought 7 of the friends to martyr them. Each one said: 'Kill me first' and why? Because they did not want to see th martyredy bodies of the others.

M.D.. In Paris it is not possible to invite many to our house at one time on account of conditions.

A.B...Now, anywhere there are strikes .It is

It is necessary that all the nations and p people should make laws and regulations. At the end all the nations will be united so that no one can break those laws and regulations. The Blessed Beauty has written that if it becomes other than this, then the result will be Bolschevism. Even her B... has been found. The Blessed Beauty h s plainly written that there will be revolutions and disturbances. There are THREE classes: high (educated), middle and lower. This last named will are dominating. The common people will dominate and that will be revolution. Irreligion will prevail and at the end the whole civilization of the world will be destroyed. Then again religion will be re-established.

About 500 Jews came to Jaffa and asked for workand were told to wait until work could be found for them. They said: 'We will not wait'. They became angry and joined the Bolschevics. There were some Muhammedans and Christians who also became Bolschevics.

Mrs C...How long will irreligion preveil? A.B...About 50 years longer. Now no one is religious save the (real) Baha'is.

Mrs.R...Will B....prevail in America? A.B....Bol...Will infect America as well.

Mrs F. The drivers of the milk-wagons etc.. receive from 50 to 80 dollars a week while the school teachers receive much less. A.B.//Notwithstanding this they complain.

Did Fygita take a walk up the mountain? Mrs F...Yes.

A.B...Be careful. If you fall you will roll down the mountain.

Nov.18. The Prison of Acca. Told by Mirza Badi . Jan.15,1920)

One day all the pilgrims and the resident believers were gathered together in the Holy Tomb of the Bab. We had come ogether under the shade of the Tree of the

Covenant and His Holiness 'Abdu'l-Baha spoke the Niagara Falls in America, saying that it is one of the greatest water falls in the world.

In this connection He said that the power the grandeur and the force of the water fall is an expression of this overflowing bounty of the Day of the Manifestation. Showing how great, majestic and powerful it is.

These holy words of the Master reminds one of His influence upon great men of position and the leaders of mankind.

Ever since the beginning of the occupation of Haifa (Sept.23,1918) all sorts and conditions of men: military or civilians have had had the honor and privilege of being in the presence of 'Abd'ul-Baha.

Field Marshal Allenbyrg the commanding General of the Egyptian Expeditionary force visited Him several times and every successive visit was conducive to greater respect and consideration on his part.

One day, together with the Master, he visited the prison of Acca as well as the Holy Tombé of Baha'u'llah, an account of which the write: writer has already given in detail.

Gen Money, the chief administrator of the occupied enemy terrotory administration south, and his successor, Major Gen. Watson, visited the Beloved several times.

The present chief administrator, Major Gen. Bols, visited the Holy Tomb of Baha'u' llah, together with Field Marshall Allenby, and had the pleasure of partsking of both material and spiritual food at the Master's. table.

Those who have the privalege of being constantly with the Master can, toa certain extent, realize the difference in the attitude of those who visit Him, and in this way can have an idea of the importance of the Cause. On June 1919 three goverment officials called on the Master--Col Criton, Asst.Administrator of Commerce, and Trade of the occupied enemy territory (administration south) Col Bentwitch, the senior judicial officer of O.E.T.(A.S.) and Maj Kerr, dept Asst. administrator, connected with the military Governor of Haifa. Each one asked a question in accordance with his beny of mind and all received sufficient convincing answers. If The point discussed in detail was regadring the legal principles of the courts and the international law problem.

The point is here: that Col.Criton stated that he was especially commissioned by the British gov. to go to Acca and to fully inspect the prison of His Holiness Baha'u'llah, and to give necessary instructions that no damage whatsoever should be done to it. The government considers that its duty is to preserve the prison in which Baha'u'llah hr spent some of His days; that thus it may become a memorial for future generations.

As a consequence of this statement the Master, 'Abdu'l-Raha gave a description of the days of the Blessed Beauty; how He was exiled from Persia and finally brought to Acca.

The three gentlemen were greatly touched and expressed their intense joy for having called on the Master with a view of acquiring teachings which could not be gotten otherwise.

It is due to the greatness of the Cause that people who were its bitterest enemies are now realizing the universal greatness of the divine principles.

This is one of the distinctive characteristics of this great Cause o the Blessed Beauty which was lacking in past generations. Nov.21,1920...Pilgrim House...Luncheon...

Questions asked by Mrs Winterburn.

Should the Japanese be educated with the white f children or separated?

A.B....The Americans may be protected in

taking some measures against the Jap.... but if they prohibit the buying of land it will create animosity.

Q... Great numbers of Japs come to America to buy land. America is afraid.

A.B...One should not exagerate the number of those who come to buy land, for land is cheap in Japan and very expensive in America.

Those who are born in the states will become attached to America and will not think for returning to Japan, and they will ask for 1 This same question came up r garding the Syrians going to Egypt.

A.E...Good! It is very good. It is very good! It is the cause of unity. It is very good, it is the cause of unity!

Q... Will the white mace hold its own on the Pacific coast....

A.B...The white race predominates. I am in

favor of the marriage of the black and white races. It is very good. Such marriages are very good. It gives a strong secon second generation, and the color changes.

The chinese will come in great numbers when they begin. It is goos to have regulations. Nov.22,1920...Home of 'Abdu'l-Baha(in His room) Last talk to the American pilgrims.

Mrs Goodall...Mrs Cooper...Mrs Ralston... Mrs Frankland.

A.B...I have had a very happy time with you...happy days. I shall never forget. You are always in my thoughts, and I will always pray for you and ask help from God for you.

Greetings to all the friends whom you meet.

I hope you will be like an eloquent book, that you will have mor effect than a book. I hope this, and expec hope to hear good news from you.

You must think that you are always here. You a e not separated from this spot. You are always in my thoughts and mind.

Mrs.G...'Abdu'l-Boha has made us very happy. A.B. You have made me happy very.

Mrs.E..To go away from here is like leaving paradise.

A.B...You are not away from Paradise. You ar always here in heart and snirit though in body we are separated. The best is the spiritual meeting, not the sphysical. A.B....Praise be to God you have been here

a month and have atteined to the privalege of visiting the Holy Tombs; have associated with the friends. Altho our gathering here at present does not seem important in the future it will produce great results. We should not look at the present, we should look to the future.

When the disciples of His Holiness Christ gathered on the mountain, at thattime the gathering together was not considered important by the people, and even there were some arong the disciples wgo could not appreciate the importance. The peoplsaid: 'What result can be obtained from the gather ing of a few fishermen or some working people Afterwards it became known what great importent tance that gathering had. The importance of that gathering shone upon the world, and now you are seeing what great results have followed. Now our gathering, altho it does not seem to be important, yet in the future it will have great results.

The cause was once confined to the city of Shiraz, very few became believers, no one paid attention at first; that is no importance was attached to their gathering. Then that gathering spread its influence to Isrhan, then to Teheran and to Khorasan, and all over Persia Then it spread to other countries, until it finally reached America. And God willing from America it will spread its influence to all the Pacific coasts, to Japan, China..-in short it will exercise its influence all over the world. Be assured of this! If all the forces of the world oppose the influence of the Cause they shall fail. Christ during are shining even until now.

You came here and asked almost all your questions, scientific, religious (problems of the kingdom), economic and social. All these have been, so far as possible, answered. It is my hope that your problems have been solved. When you return you should arise in service as much as possible.

Be very lenient and kind to the Japanese and show kindness also to the Chinese. You should use all means so that these differ-. ences between the Japanese and Americans may be done away with. Similarly you should use all means to spread the Word of God in Japan and China. Be very kind to all these people and explain to them the oneness of the world of humanity, which is one of the basic principles of His Holiness Baha'u'llah,-that all the neople are the sheep of God and God is the affectionate Shepherd. He is affectionate to all Hbs sheep. This is the potency of God. Therefore to us the Chinese. Japanese, French, English, Persian and Germans are all the sheep of God. We must be kind to all.

In brief, you should be kind to the Japanese. I spoke to you about them today. You should remamber what I have said.

Now that you are going you should be bearer of glad-tidings and you should be like unto a breeze which blows from a rose-garden: you should be like unto rain which pours down from the clouds of mercy; you should be like unto waves which rise from the sea of truth I shall pray for you, that you may, day by day, develop in the Kingdom of God and obtain greater might, and find keencears; that you is first holiness Christ said, the breath of the Holy Spirit may inspire your hearts.
